SALEM (AP) - The Board of Education today voted to recommend that the Textbook Commission hold a hearing on complaints against some public school text-

The action came after several people had called some of the books objectionable.

George Burgess, Tigard, said a literature text for 9th graders,
"Adventures for Today," is
"cheap dime novel trash." He
said some other books were equally objectionable.

May Darling, member of the board, said the complaints should go before the Textbook Commistion. "We have no authority to say whether the books are good, bad or indifferent," she said, cit-ing the law which provides that the board name a five-member commission to adopt the text-books. The board then is required to enter into contracts with the publishers for them.

It was suggested to the board that a lay committee be named by the board to make recomndations to the commission.
