53 Bulls Sold At Sale For A Total Of \$25,105

LAKEVIEW — There were 53 bulls sold for a total of \$25,105, or an average of \$474, at the annual sale sponsored by the Lake County Stockgrowers' Association at the fairgrounds in Lakeview Friday, October 14.

Considering market conditions in the cattle industry, the sale was considered a distinct success by all concerned. Only four bulls went under the \$400 mark and the reserve champion, owned by Harold Eskin of Grass Valley, Oregon, reached \$750, bought by Hotchkiss and Maxwell of the 70 Ranch. The champion, consigned by Seven Oaks Herofords of Central Point, was sold for \$725 to Fisher and Ragdale of Eagle Point.

Other purchasers included George Carlon, Fitzgerald and Sons, Vancil Withers, Gus Allen, Lloyd H. Hill, Yamesy Land and Cattle Company (Ted Hyde), Ben Vernon, Mike Deely, Robert F. Smith of Burns, Fisher Ranches, Inc., J. D. Corum, Raymond Cook, Jerry O'Leary and Son, Grobs Brothers of Bonanza, Dan Barry, Warren Laird, Bob Weir, Norman Quigley of Canby, California, Edward Murphy, and Leland Ritter.

The champion pen of two was consigned by Harold Eskin and sold to Gus Allen at \$570 each, and the reserve champion pen, consigned by Ted and Mildred Graves of Burns, went to Jewel Corum at \$480. Allen was the heaviest buyer with a total of 10 bulls costing \$4,735.

Portable Field Hospital Is Available

LAKEVIEW—Lake County now has available for emergency use a 200-bed portable field hospital which is stored in the basement of the courthouse in Lakeview.

The equipment was secured through Civil Defense participation and was shipped here from Yakima last week and unloaded and located under the supervision of Ernest McKinney, director, and Glen Tyler, assistant director, for the Civil Defense program in this area. It remains the property of the federal government.

The hospital is complete enough to run to full capacity for two days on its own supplies without outside assistance, in case of a war caused or other type of national emergency. It has its own electric light plant, a 1,500-gallon water tank, two complete operating rooms, oxygen equipment, and an X-ray unit with its own power unit. In addition there are 200 cots with pillows and blankets. The other supply will not have to be replaced for five years during storage, and some drugs will be replaced in 1963. All boxes are marked and numbered and stored in sections that can be used in part or as a whole.

A running file of all equipment is kept in Salem and Lake County is responsible for replacing anything that might have to be used in a local emergency. Tyler is custodian of the equipment and

Redding Man's Body Found Near Worden

The body of a Redding man, Fred McDaniels, in his late 50s, was found October 13, lying in tall grass, some distance from his sheep camp trailer. The camp was located seven miles north of Worden in a remote part of Klamath County.

The discovery was made by the man's employer, Cliff Williams of Corning, who had brought his sheep bands to Klamath County for grazing. He investigated when he found the herder missing and located the body guarded by the man's small sheep dog.

Apparently McDaniels had been dead for only a short time since the cook stove in the trailer was still warm.

Klamath County Coroner Dr. J. Martin Adams said death apparently was from natural causes. The body was sent to Redding for services and interment.
