Spread cut surfaces with parsley "butter." To make: Combine equal parts of soft butter or margarine and parsley flakes; season with lemon juice. String each loaf on a long, sharp-pointed skewer, inserting the skewer through the loaf center. Heat over hot coals or under a broiler, turning to brown the bread on all sides.

Milk Supply Saves Time

It's a wise homemaker who stocks the refrigerator with a few extra quarts of milk for the weekend. Not only are the children home for noon meals and their friends dropping in for snacks, but there is no better food for unexpected occasions.

Say the crowd decides to stop by after the football game. A hot, hearty chowder is ready in no time by adding a can of oysters or clams to a quart of piping hot milk. A dollop of butter, some salt and pepper, and the feast is ready.

The cupboard can look completely bare, but if there's milk in the refrigerator and a few cream-filled chocolate mint patties, it's all that's needed to concoct a truly different hot beverage for after the movies. The mints are melted with half a cup of hot milk and heated with additional milk until steaming.

Nothing is simpler on a busy Saturday than popping some custards in to bake while the oven is still hot from preparing dinner. By the time the meal is over and the kitchen tidy, the delicate cups of custard with crusty cinnamon tops are ready to cool. A light, nutritious snack is ready for midnight raiders; with any luck, there might be some for Sunday supper dessert.

Adding these tricks to the time-tested time-savers like preparing instant puddings or canned soups with milk and the cook who keeps plenty of milk on hand earns a reputation as best impromptu chef in the block.

Creamed Potatoes

A perfect accompaniment to a good steak, creamed potatoes with Worcestershire Sauce added will win fresh plaudits for the hostess.

Worcestershire Creamed Potatoes

2 cups cubed cold boiled potatoes
2 Tbsp. butter
2 Tbsp. all-purpose flour
1 cup milk
1/4 tsp. salt
1 tsp. Worcestershire Sauce

Melt butter in top of double boiler over direct heat. Add flour, stirring until smoothly blended. Cook, stirring constantly, for 3 minutes over low heat. Add milk gradually, stirring to keep smooth until it reaches boiling point. Reduce heat and cook 3 minutes longer. Remove from fire, add Worcestershire Sauce and blend in thoroughly. Add the cubed potatoes and mix gently with sauce. Place over hot water to keep hot. When ready to serve, top with an extra pat of butter and garnish with paprika.

BETTER BREAKFASTS

Here's a colorful and hearty breakfast idea for the school set. Serve half-shells of luscious, sun-ripened California mid-summer cantaloupes filled with crisp ready-to-eat flake cereal. Top with a scoop of vanilla ice cream just before serving. Buttered raisin toast and a large glass of milk will round out the nutritious meal.
