SALEM (AP)—The Legislative Interim Committee on Natural Resources is calling for abolition of the Fish and Game Commission and the transfer of their functions to a proposed Department of Fish and Game.

State Sen. Andrew J. Naterlin, R-Newport, chairman of the committee, said the change is needed to protect the salmon fishery.

The committee proposal calls for the new department to be financed entirely from license fees paid by hunters, anglers and commercial fishermen.

In other action, the committee proposed abolishment of the state Marine Board.

R. F. Rittenhouse, Marine Board director, in an interview criticized the proposal, saying it "was prompted by a desire to use the board's surplus revenue from boat registration fees for other use."

The board was created at the request and in the interest of both commercial and recreational boating, he said.

"Gov. Hatfield's Committee on Government Reorganization studied the functions of the Marine Board. It rejected any changes in the board," Rittenhouse said.
