

Pels Seek To Break Comet Spell; Owls Shoot For OCC Championship

KU Club Hunting SOC Win

The Klamath Union Pelican football team is determined to snap the jinx that has hovered over every meeting with the Central Point Crater Comets and most KU Homecoming celebrations.

They get another chance Friday night on Modoc Field when they meet the Craterians in the final Southern Oregon Conference clash of the season. KU enters the action on the short end of an 0-3 count in league play. For the overall season they have a 2-1 record, four losses, 1 tied record. One game remains on the Pel 1960 slate after Friday night—with Borah High in Boise.

Coach Bob Williams gave his ball-carriers extra work in the Tuesday practice session. Each player was given a number of tacklers, spaced so that they were on him almost immediately after he had either shrugged off a tackle or been downed by the man ahead.

Also on the schedule were both defensive and offensive drills against Central Point maneuvers. Although the annual homecoming bonfire will go ahead as scheduled Thursday night on the usual Oregon Avenue site, the football players will not participate in the building of the huge pile. In the past the KU griders have worked long hours in collecting the material to be burned. This year they will concentrate on the hall game itself.

They will, however, be on hand for the fire itself and make known their choice of a queen to rule over the festivities.

Friday afternoon the players and coaches will appear at a big pep rally to be held on Modoc Field at 2:15 prior to a parade through downtown Klamath Falls.

The Trojan-Husky tiff pairs the league tailenders in a struggle that could leave them tied for the last spot or could drop the Trojans clear to the end.

SHA mentor Marv Delplanche, who is at a loss to explain the team's losing efforts, said, "We've lost some that I didn't feel we should lose. One thing wrong is that while our backfield has shown steady improvement over the season I've seen little or no betterment of the line's play."

The 1960 Oregon Collegiate Conference championship is just a game away for the Oregon Tech Owls, but that game will undoubtedly prove the highest hurdle they've had to clear this year.

With this thought in mind the Owl practice sessions have been concentrated on a swarm of brand new plays. The Techmen's new offensive strategy is destined to erase whatever advantage the Oregon College Wolves have gained by scouting four Owl games thus far.

The Mile-High elevators tangle with the OCE gliders in Monmouth at 1:30 Saturday afternoon in the Owls' final conference match of the season. The Owls enter the crucial contest sporting a six-game unbeaten string for 1960 and an 11 straight string in so far as conference play is concerned.

A number of Owl gridders, including quarterback Roy Johnson and guard Andy Cook, have never played in a game in which the Owls lost to a league adversary. They have definitely planned that the Wolves will not spoil their three year records.

The Techsters won the '58 league crown but were forced to forfeit when an ineligibility technicality turned up. In 1959 the Owls had little trouble securing the championship with no strings attached.

The Owl coaching staff has been relatively secretive concerning the new offensive and the availability of players for the big weekend test. A few players were noticeably limping at the conclusion of the Owl-SOC conflict and saw only brief action against LaVerne last Saturday. It is expected that all will be ready for work Saturday, however.

Bob Pettit, Elgin Baylor At It Again

Pettit scored 35 points as the Hawks, perennial winners of the National Basketball Association's Western Division, defeated the Syracuse Nationals, 123-100.

Baylor, looking better than ever in his third season in the league, scored 36 points, hit 14 of his 27 shots from the floor, made 8 of 10 charity tosses and leaped for 27 rebounds. His performance paced Los Angeles to a 120-118 victory over the New York Knicks.

The Lakers, supposed to be weak at the center position, still managed to rebound the New Yorkers, 58-48, but Willie Naulls, who played his college ball at UCLA, came close to matching Baylor's performance for the Knicks. He scored 33 points and hit five out of five free throws.

Baylor got good backing in the scoring department from West Virginia rookie Jerry West, who had 18 points, and Bob Leonard, who had 16.

Pettit, as usual, was backed up by his mates in one of professional basketball's most potent front lines. Cliff Hagan scored 16 and Clyde Lovellette had 15. Dolph Schayes scored 26 for Syracuse.

Cincinnati's Royals will give the city of Detroit a look at its flashy rookie, Oscar Robertson, as they play the Pistons in the only NBA action tonight.

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Paul Quits Reds To Boss Houston

HOUSTON, Tex. (UPI) — Gabe Paul, a man who rose through the ranks from batboy to baseball executive, today took over the reins of the National League's new Houston franchise.

He was hired away from the Cincinnati Reds, where he has served as vice president and general manager since Sept. 27, 1951.
