Former Yankee Pitcher To Address Club

Gomez set a record during his 12 years with the Yankees by pitching six world series wins with no losses. He retired from baseball in 1942.

The team won seven American League pennants during Gomez's reign with them.

Bark Beetle Being Probed

Entomologists from the state Department of Agriculture are in Klamath Falls in an attempt to determine the prevalence of the European Bark Beetle in this area. The beetle had been found recently in limited numbers by J. D. Vertrees, Klamath County agent.

The insect, the first found in Oregon in Chinese elm, carries the Dutch Elm disease which has damaged American Elm on the east coast. No sign of the disease has been located here, the county agent's office said Tuesday.

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Ed Group Completes Report

Oregon public schools will advance further if a report recently released by the Oregon Education Policies Commission is acted upon. "When We Believe..." is a study of basic issues in Oregon education and is the third of three reports completed by this independent commission of the Oregon Education Association.

This report is concerned with quality education in Oregon, according to Dr. Hester Turner, commission secretary. It provides a means by which both educators and the public may evaluate their educational programs and cooperatively work to improve these programs, Dr. Turner stated.

The study states if we believe public education is the privilege of every child then we will recognize education is basically but more than intellectual development, that there are many ways of learning.

The study challenges schools to have a flexible curriculum, one planned for the interests of every child. It identifies that a textbook is only one of the many tools of learning.

The commission stated teachers must be educated to the larger purposes of education and that high standards of teacher preparation are essential. Continued professional study and self improvement, as well as a reasonable class load is essential for every educator.

Other needs of our schools that are stressed in the report are sufficient and appropriate school buildings, adequate facilities and equipment, and extensive educational research.
