Under Bureau of Advertising Direction a study was conducted by the research firm, Leonard J. Bisbing, of Milwaukee, during the 1960 Wisconsin primary. It disclosed that . . .

Only four days before voting, 40% of those intending to vote hadn't decided on a candidate . . . proving that advertising is vital right up to election day.

The Wisconsin study also showed that people most familiar with the candidates stressed newspapers as their prime source of information.

"The American Voter" a book recently published by the University of Michigan Survey Research Center says the same thing . . . "Printed media projected a much stronger image of a candidate."

Herald and News advertising deadlines are two working days prior to publication. The last day for political advertising will be Monday, Nov. 7. Copy for that publication will be accepted up to 5:00 p.m. Friday, Nov. 4.
