

KU Pelicans Break Spell, Conquer Comets 27-6

Spectacular Dash Highlights Victory

A couple of time-worn "traditions" at Klamath Union High School were relegated to the memory-book Friday night when the Pelicans upset the visiting Crater Comets 27-6 in a Southern Oregon Conference football game on Modoc Field.

The Pelicans, sparked by the brilliant performance of junior quarterback Sherm Allen, displayed a great overall team effort in dealing the Central Point eleven the first defeat they have ever received at the hands of a Klamath Falls club.

The victory also marked the first time in unnumbered years that the Pelicans have been able to call their homecoming celebration a complete success.

SPECTACULAR DASH
Almost overshadowing the victory and the manner in which the team "moved" to its first SOC win of the season, was a spectacular fourth quarter 85-yard dash by Allen.

Going into the final canto leading 27-0 the Pelicans were finally forced into their lone punting situation of the game on their own 37-yard stripe.

Young Allen saw his attempted boot ricochet high in the air off the chest of a hard-charging Comet lineman who crashed through the line. Although the advantage was clearly with the CP player when the ball bounded back to the KU eight yard line, he lost momentarily track of its progress . . . and then it was too late.

Allen whirled and in a headlong dash to the sideline scooped up the loose ball and started an amazing display of broken field running. Shaking off a number of would-be tacklers he carved his way through the entire Comet defense with the help of some beautiful blocks, one a two-for-one shot by Ken Lewis, and sped to the far side of the field where he was finally pulled down on the CP seven.

Although in actual yardage marked off, Allen's blitz was good for 85 yards, it was estimated that he had traveled about 115 on his journey.

The record books show there is no such thing as a sure winner in the National Football League. But if six games hold true for Sunday's fixtures, the New York Giants will still be unbeaten at the top of the Eastern Conference and the Green Bay Packers and Chicago Bears will be tied for the Western Conference lead.

The Giants (3-0-1) are favored to take the St. Louis Cardinals (2-3) by 10 points at Yankee Stadium. Earlier in the season at St. Louis, the Giants thumped the Cards 35-14.

Green Bay (3-1) and Chicago (3-1-1) are both touchdown favorites at home to Detroit (1-3) in the league's other game. The Rams are favored by 10 points at the Los Angeles Coliseum.

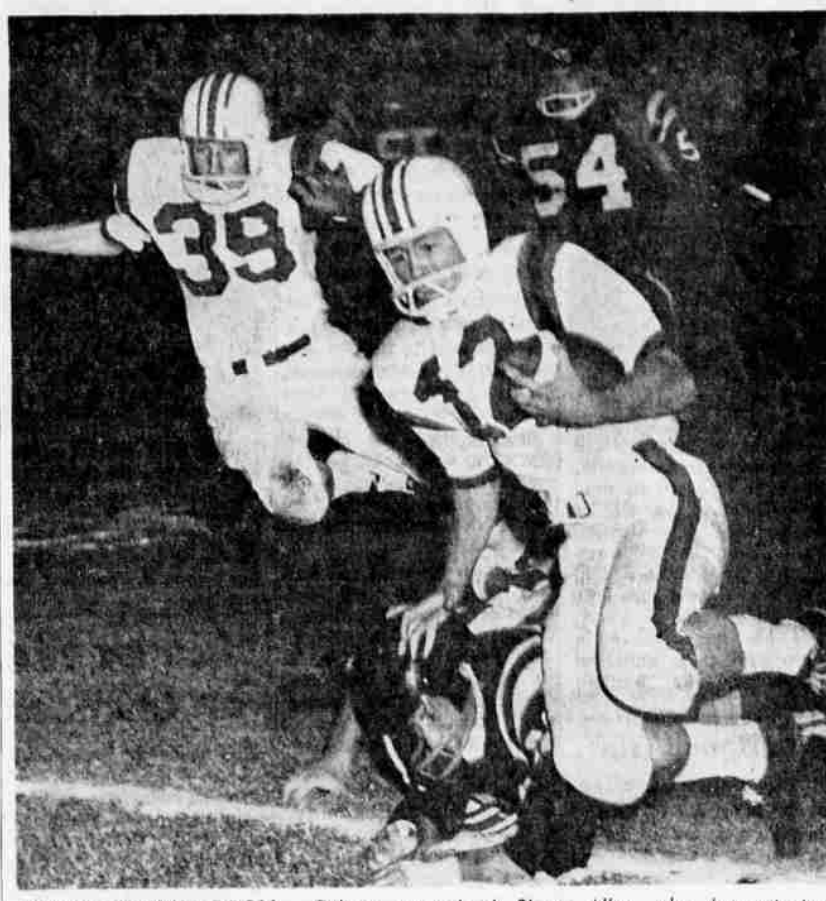

LAKEVIEW (Special)—The Madras Buffaloes whacked the Lakeview Honkers to a 25-12 halftime lead but turned on the power in the second half to record a 25-12 Greater Oregon League win here Friday night.

Lakeview took a 6-0 lead in the first quarter when Larry Peters hit end Doug Maxwell with an 18-yard touchdown pass. Madras' Bob Stewart fell on Peters' fumble in the end zone for the first Buffalo TD and then linebacker Bob Mobley gave the Lakers their halftime lead by going 30 yards to paydirt with an intercepted pass.

The Buffaloes' weight advantage began to tell in the second half. Halfback Gary Moe shot through a big hole at left tackle for 40 yards in the third quarter. Dennis Tingle ran 20 yards in the fourth quarter to give Madras the lead and Jim Humphrey intercepted a pass and scored from 35 yards out to add an insurance TD.

"We played well but they just wore us down," Lakeview coach Howard Hopper said after the game. "It was our best game since our opener with Redmond."

The Lakers are in third place with a 3-2 record while Madras (4-1) has a chance at the title.

Raiders Nip Titans, 28-27
NEW YORK (UPI)—The Oakland Raiders, down 24-14 after three quarters, roared from behind to edge New York 28-27 in a rainy American Football League thriller Friday night.

The Raider victory left both teams 4-4 on the season. Hero of the battle was old pro Vito Parrilli, who came off the bench in the second half to engineer long touchdown drives of 91 and 71 yards in the fourth stanza.

The first-half was highlighted by a series of lengthy scoring plays. For New York, tiny Leon Burton collided with a teammate in the end-zone and then recovered to gallop 101 yards on a spectacular kickoff return.

Other Titan scores came when Don Maynard took a 47-yard scoring pass from ailing Al Dorow and Art Powell gathered in another TD pass from Dorow on a play that covered 76 yards.

Oakland scored as Billy Lott took a pass from Tom Flores on a 25-yard play which culminated in a drive highlighted by a 34-yard gallop by Lott.

Oakland also tallied when Flores and Al Holsington combined on a 61-yard pass play.

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
