Kennedy Usually Off To Late Start

Editor's Note: This in many ways has been a unique presidential campaign. Here Arthur Edson, who has traveled with both candidates, compares how the two men have gone about seeking the highest job the free world has to offer.

Anyone who travels with both candidates is more impressed at how frequently the techniques differ than at how much they differ.

By ARTHUR EDSON WASHINGTON (AP) — An hour before Sen. John F. Kennedy was to arrive in Chicago recently, reporters were handed a minute-by-minute schedule of his four-hour stay there.

Each has tried to flush out votes by train and by motorcade, but the favorite transportation has been the three-airplane caravan.

Across the top of this detailed, two-page timetable were these words: "We are behind schedule—all movements must be expedited."

The candidate rides in one plane, with the rear end partitioned off so that he can have privacy. With him are his top advisers, plus three newsmen, one from each of the two press associations and one a pool man representing the others.

This illustrates as well as anything a major difference in the way Kennedy and Vice President Richard M. Nixon run their campaigns.

Don't think the newsmen get on the inside track by being physically closer to the great man. Nixon and Kennedy have about as much time for chit-chat as a surgeon would have as he nears the end of the delicate operation.

Nixon tries to be meticulously on time and usually is. Kennedy tries to be approximately on time, but he nearly always is off to a late start, and so he's rarely on schedule—so rarely he can be written off as running late even before he hits town.

Other newspaper men are riding the second plane, and photographers, left-over staff personnel and baggage are toled in the third one.

This attitude affects their campaigns. An air of careful premeditation of anticipating each crisis and trying to prepare for it, permeates the Nixon camp.

It would be hard to prove, but considering the unflagging industry of both men and the way the airplane enables them to reach several major cities in a day, it's probable that no other two candidates have been seen and heard by so many.

An air of improvisation, as if someone forgot the script, but it doesn't matter much anyway, seems, at least at times, to control Kennedy and his employees. But these differences can be stressed too much.

But it's not just the way the candidates flit about. It's the similar ways in which they go about their speech-making that is most striking.

The feeling here is that Khrushchev will try to exploit American inability to agree to quick negotiations by claiming again that the United States is stalling Russia's peaceful efforts to settle the Berlin and German crises.

Khrushchev, in a talk last week with the West German ambassador to Moscow, said that he wanted some decision on Berlin by May 1. He added that he would sign a separate peace treaty with East Germany by next September at the latest, if the Allies had not come to terms by that time.
