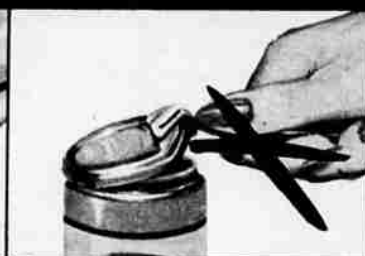
Two old friends met on the street, one looking extremely crestfallen. "It's been one of those bad days," he explained mournfully.
