CAMERA Angles

COLOGNE (AP)—One of the
shortest kept secrets of the 1960
Photokina involved two of the
newest Agfa cameras.

They were shown secretly to
some dealers to prepare them
for the future—but not to photo
writers.

Within a day or two, however,
whispers were heard everywhere:
"Have you seen the new Agfa
movie camera and the automatic
motorized miniature?"

When I asked company repre-
sentatives about these rumors,
they uncovered the hidden cam-
eras. Delayed "surprise" or not,
the cameras make news because
they are a step ahead in certain
features.

The 8mm Movex Reflex is the
first home movie camera with a
magazine or cassette in which
regular roll film can be preloa-
ded. Then, after shooting the first
25 feet, the cassette is simply
turned over to side number two
and filming is immediately con-
tinued.

This rollfilm-magazine feature
is unique but the camera's other
qualities are important.

It is a fully automatic electric-
eye camera with an f-1.8 Schnei-
der Variogen zoom lens which
ranges from 7.5 to 37.5 mm in fo-
cal length, a ratio of one to five.
It focuses through the universal
reflex viewfinder in full size im-
age from four feet to infinity.
Screw - in supplementary lenses
bring accurate focusing down to
20 inches.

When the zoom lens is re-
moved from its bayonet mount, a
basic 13mm f-1.8 lens remains
in the camera.

The camera has five filming
speeds (8, 16, 24, 32, 48 frames
per second) and a single shot re-
lease. Once the filming speed and
the type of film being used is
set (ASA 10 to 500), the release
button sets off correctly exposed
filming or warns that the light
is inadequate.

A further unusual feature of
the camera is the long-run hand
wind. One winding is enough to
run off 25 feet or more than
twice the usual run.

Turning to Agfa's 35mm Opti-
ma Electric camera, we find in
addition to the automatic pic-
ture-taking features found on
most new electric-eye models,
this has automatic motorized
transport of the film plus cocking
of the shutter.

The power is supplied by two
penlight batteries. Pressure on
the release button snaps one pic-
ture off, if maintained, a second,
third, fourth, etc., until the en-
tire roll of film is finished, if
wanted.

The camera has a 45mm f-2.8
lens and offers the photographer
a choice of three settings after
which the automatic mechanism
takes over completely. The cam-
era can be set on a blue, black
or yellow mark.

The blue is for all normal
subject matter. The electric eye
scans the scene and selects speeds
from 1-30 to 1-200, along with
the correctly coupled lens aper-
ture.

In poor light or for extreme
sharpness, the camera would be
set on the black mark. Here, the
electric eye selects slower expo-
sure speeds from 1-30 to 1-80 with
the correct lens opening.

For action shots, the yellow

mark is used. Here automatic
selection of speeds from 1-200 to
1-500 would be made according
to the light. If the light is insuf-
ficient, a red flag appears in the
viewfinder. Then the photograp-
her may shift to the blue or black
fields.

These two cameras will not
reach the United States for six
or seven months or more. How-
ever, Agfa had another new cam-
era which is now on the produc-
tion line and which met with
great public interest here. It is
the first twin-lens miniature re-
flex camera with full automa-
tion.

Called the Optima Reflex, it's
a 35mm camera in which two
small lenses, one above the other,
seem to be set into a larger lens
and with a pentaprism roof
above.

The viewing and taking lenses
are each 45mm f-2.8. The camera
has optical signals by which the
photographer knows when he can
shoot.

A black field warns that the
film hasn't been changed after
the previous snap. Moving the
rapid wind lever sets the shutter
and a red field appears. Now the
photographer sights his subject
matter and presses the release
lever lightly. If there is suffi-
cient light, the red field changes
to green "Go Ahead" signal and
continued downward pressure au-
tomatically sets the shortest pos-
sible speed and correct lens open-
ing and snaps the picture.

If the light is inadequate, the
red flag remains. The camera
can then be shifted from auto-
matic operation to either flash or
time exposure setting.
