Owners of woodlots in Klamath and Lake counties are invited to contact Bob Madsen, district warden, state forestry department, for information concerning forest management and insurance.

Madsen's address is P.O. Box 13, Klamath Agency, Oregon. The phone number is Chiloquin 783-2219.

During a recent meeting of crop insurance men in Oregon, foresters learned that insurance for tree crops is not yet available. The insurance men said such insurance may soon be possible if demand is high enough.

The organization will have to make a study to determine ap-

praisal methods, average rate of possible losses, and premium rates, said Dick Olson, state farm forester who attended the conference.

Madsen says tree planting season is approaching and offers suggestions for woodlot owners.

Those interested may obtain order blanks from the state forest nursery for seedlings by writing Madsen or Olson, Box 71, Medford.

Madsen also has free information concerning proper methods of planting, thinning, pruning, brush removal, Christmas tree culture, marketing and other subjects.

Madsen said "on the farm" meetings of farmers and foresters may be arranged by contacting him.

Historians Honor Memory Of City Founder

A niece and nephew, Mrs. G. H. (Nell) Hancock and W. R. Boyd, both of Klamath Falls, were joined by historians of Klamath and Siskiyou counties October 29 in commemorating the founder of Linkville, George Nurse.

Some 100 interested persons were present at the Willard Hotel for a luncheon and review of the early settler's philanthropy.

Speakers were Floyd Wynne, city councilman who reviewed the early life of the man who bought the land from the state of Oregon upon which the small settlement grew, and Orlo Steel, Yreka. Steel knew Nurse in his later years.

Wynne also announced the proposal by ballot at the November election to pay tribute to the city's founder by renaming the present Veterans Memorial Park the George Nurse Memorial Park. Only recognition to date that has

MOSCOW (AP)—Foreign Minister Krim Bel Kasseem of the Algerian provisional government said Monday Algerians are fighting not only the French but all the countries of the North Atlantic Treaty Organization and primarily the United States.

Lorraine Quillan, president of the Klamath County society, presided.

Meteor Blazes Across Oregon Skies

BEND, Ore. (AP)—A meteor that blazed across Oregon skies and was visible over Washington on a Sept. 20 west-to-east run may have left some of its bits in Idaho's Sawtooth Mountains or nearby Big Baldy.

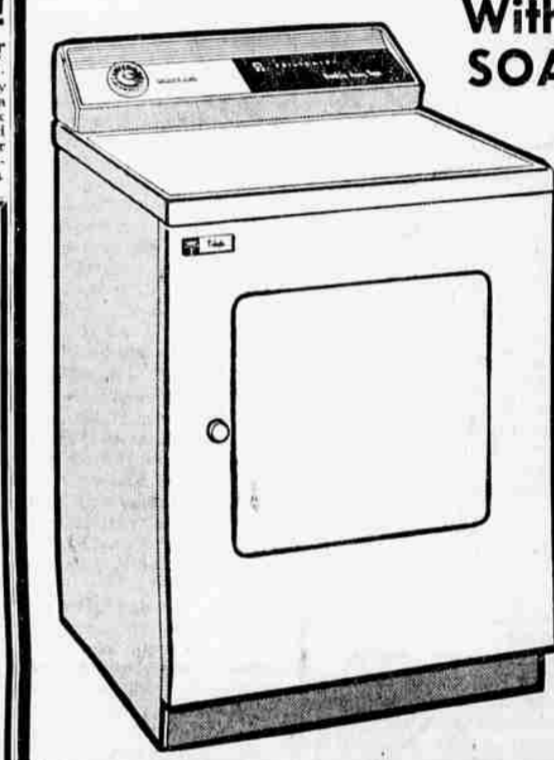
Phil P. Brogan, Pacific Northwest director for the American Meteor Society, said Saturday many observers in Oregon, Idaho and Washington supplied reports that made possible charting of the fireball's course.

He said that as it flashed across the sky throwing a shower of sparks that seemed to form a tail, Brogan said it began to flow at an estimated altitude of 60 miles, exploded with a flare, then disappeared as it crossed into Idaho from north of Ontario.
