

Republicans Hope To Reverse Trends In Election Of 27 New Governors

WASHINGTON (AP) — Republicans, who have been losing ground steadily to Democrats in recent statehouse races, hope to reverse the trend Nov. 8 when 27 governors will be elected.

The seats at stake include 14 now held by Democrats and 13 now held by Republicans and involve 5 governorships which were in the upset column in 1958.

In the last two general elections involving governorships, Democrats have made steady inroads into Republican statehouse holdings. They ousted 9 GOP governors in 1958 and 5 in 1956 for a total of 7 over a four-year span. Republicans captured 4 Democratic governorships in 1958 and 3 in 1956.

Of the 14 incumbent governors seeking re-election, 8 are Democrats and 6 are Republicans.

Major national interest centers

on contests in Michigan, Illinois and Kansas.

In Michigan John B. Swainson, a Democrat, is opposed by Paul D. Bagwell, Republican, for the seat yielded by G. Mennen Williams, Democrat, after a record of six consecutive two-year terms.

George Docking, incumbent Democratic governor of Kansas, is trying to make more political history by becoming the first of his party to serve three consecutive terms. In 1958, Docking became the first Democrat ever to be re-elected governor of his state. He has two opponents this year, John Anderson, Republican, and J. J. Steele, Prohibitionist.

In Illinois, Republican William G. Stratton faces a tough battle for a third consecutive four-year term. Stratton took over the Illinois Statehouse in the 1952 election when Adlai E. Stevenson quit.

are Frank B. Morrison, Democrat, and John R. Cooper, Republican.

His opponents are Otto Kerner, Democrat, and Edward C. Gross, Socialist-Labor.

Four of the five governors who figured in upsets in 1958 are seeking re-election. They are Paul Fannin of Arizona and Christopher Del Sesto of Rhode Island, Republicans, and John Burroughs of New Mexico and Ralph Herseth of South Dakota, Democrats.

Fannin's Democratic opponent is Lee Ackerman, Del Sesto is opposed by John A. Nott Jr., Democrat. Contesting Herseth's re-election bid is Archie Gubbrud, Republican. Burroughs is opposed by Republican Edwin L. Mechem, whom Burroughs ousted two years ago.

In Nebraska, which switched from Republican to Democratic in 1958 by electing Ralph G. Brooks, the contestants this year are Frank B. Morrison, Democrat, and John R. Cooper, Republican.

Brooks died last September after winning the Democratic senatorial nomination. His GOP lieutenant governor, Dwight W. Burney, now is governor.

Other incumbent governors seeking re-election are Orval E. Faubus, Democrat, Arkansas; John H. Reed, Maine, Republican; Orville L. Freeman, Minnesota, Democrat; Wesley Powell, Republican, New Hampshire; Price Daniel, Texas, Democrat; George D. Clary, Utah, Republican; Albert D. Rosellini, Washington, Democrat; and Gaylord Nelson, Wisconsin, Democrat.

Faubus is opposed by Henry Britt, Republican; Reed by Frank M. Coffin, Democrat; Freeman by Elmer L. Andersen, Republican; Powell by Bernard L. Boutin, Democrat; Daniel by William M. Steger, Republican; Clyde by Wil-

liam A. Barlocker, Democrat; running for the Senate.

Nelson by Philip G. Kuehn, Republican.

Rosellini has three opponents: Lloyd J. Andrews, Republican; Henry Killman, Socialist-Labor, and Jack Wright, Socialist-Workers.

Other contestants are these: DELAWARE—John W. Rollins, Republican, and Elbert N. Carvel, Democrat. The incumbent, J. Caleb Boggs, is a Republican.

FLORIDA — Farris Bryant, Democrat, and George C. Petersen, Republican. The incumbent, LeRoy Collins, is a Democrat.

MASSACHUSETTS — Joseph D. James T. Blair Jr., is a Democrat.

Ward, Democrat; John A. Volpe, Republican; Guy S. Williams, Prohibitionist, and Henning A. Blomen, Socialist-Labor. The incumbent, Foster Furcolo, is a Democrat.

MISSOURI — John M. Dalton, Democrat, and Edward G. Farmer, Republican. The incumbent, L. Gavin, Republican. The incumbent, Luther H. Hodges, is a Democrat.

MONTANA — Donald R. Nutter, Republican, and Paul Cannon, Democrat. The incumbent, J. Hugo Aronson, is a Republican.

NORTH CAROLINA — Terry Sanford, Democrat, and Robert Democrat, and Edward G. Farmer, Republican. The incumbent, Luther H. Hodges, is a Democrat.

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NORTH DAKOTA — C. P. Dahl, Republican; William L. Guy, Democrat, and Herschel Lashko-

wick, Independent. The incumbent, John E. Davis, is a Republican.

VERMONT — F. Ray Keyser Jr., Republican, and Russell F. Niquette, Democrat. The incumbent, Robert T. Stafford, is a Republican.

WEST VIRGINIA — Harold E. Neely, Republican, and William W. Barron, Democrat.

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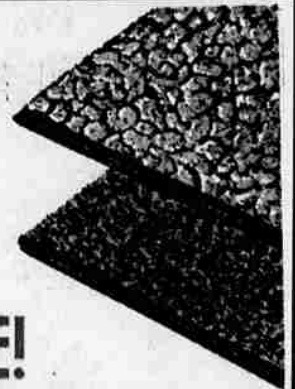
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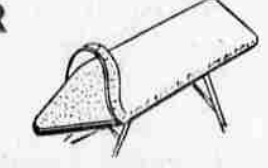
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
