

Klamath Homes Thrill To Fine Music



THE ELECTRIC organ and the piano are becoming not uncommon in most American homes. Sales of electric organs — large and small — are exceeding sales of pianos in many areas, and in Klamath Falls, at least one dealer reports, sales of organs lead piano sales almost double. While not too many people achieve a professional or skilled status with the electric organ (and offshoots of the organ) new teaching methods and techniques permit many people to satisfy their musical cravings through "melody" approaches to learning music on the organ. They find the organ a source of great personal pleasure and are content with the ability to play melody and chords as a means of relaxation.

In the Klamath area, many qualified music instructors refine the natural or trained abilities of piano and organ students for those who wish to carry on in the music field.
