'Voice From Home' Set To Cheer U.S. Servicemen

For Christmas this year, American servicemen overseas would prefer "Home, Sweet Home."

That's the word received today from Washington, D.C., by the Klamath Basin Chapter of the American Red Cross, for families with sons, daughters, husbands or fathers serving with American armed forces stationed far away.

Next to being home for the holidays, servicemen tell Red Cross workers that personal messages from home are most valued. To enable local families to send personal messages a "Voices From Home" program will begin Nov. 14 and continue through Nov. 30, operating at the local chapter headquarters in the county library building, 126 South Third Street. Members of servicemen's families are invited to come to the Red Cross office and make a recorded Christmas message. The record is then given to the family member to mail to the serviceman. All bases have facilities for playing back of the records and the recordings have proved to be big hits with the servicemen who urge that family members "Keep 'em cheerful!"

Hours for making the recordings will be from 1 to 5 p.m. Mondays through Fridays; the Red Cross office will also be open Tuesday evening, Nov. 15, from 7 to 9 p.m. for families unable to come during daytime hours.

Hatfield Stands Behind His Charges Against Rep. Ullman

Gov. Mark Hatfield said last weekend he is standing behind his charge that Congressman Al Ullman did not give full cooperation to Space Age Industrial Park project in the Boardman Bombing Range area.

"Congressman Ullman, in trying to move the credit clock backward, either failed to see the possibilities in Boardman or he could not unify all parties concerned to see the project through," the governor said.

"The facts are that the congressman buckled under the pressure of a handful of wilful men who pressured him into timidity and the whole project was nearly lost."

"Congressman Ullman fears a major population development east of the mountains and has lost our economic acceleration program every step of the way," for the property as a result of co-

Hatfield said. "He thinks the answer is always through federal government officials at all levels, legislation but we have high hopes and private enterprise."
