

Soroptimists Hear Immigration Talk

Immigration was the topic for the Oct. 27 luncheon meeting of the Klamath Falls Soroptimist Club, at the Winema Hotel.

Melvene Nitschelm, speaker, brought out five points taken from the Congressional Record for revision of U.S. immigration laws as follows: (1) remove ceiling of 100 for Asiatic-Pacific people; (2) use 1920 census as basis instead of 1920 census; (3) annual acceptance of 1-6 of one percent of total population; (4) abandon concept of race and ethnic classifications by substituting number of immigrants accepted from each area, using 1924-1959 as a basis; (5) distribute unused quotas from one country to another.

A phonograph recording by Mrs. Shmied White, president general of the DAR, gave the three purposes of the Walter McCarren act which has been introduced into Congress: (1) to provide an immigration system to maintain population and cultural balance; (2) close gate against Communist, fascist, criminal groups with power to deport undesirable; (3) non-political method of admitting immigrants.

Sources of the McCarren Act are: (1) 180 front groups organized by Communists to work against the law; (2) self-seeking politicians and minority leaders; (3) do-gooders who want to solve problems of the world by opening immigration.

To help individuals know the facts, tell others the truth about immigration and contact senators and representatives since this is a vital issue.

Neither driver received more than minor injuries but their cars sustained considerable damage.

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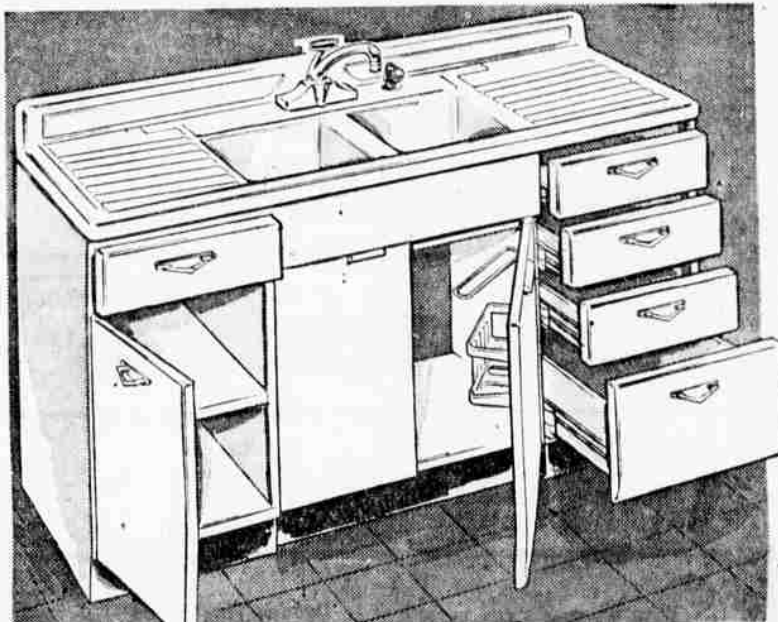
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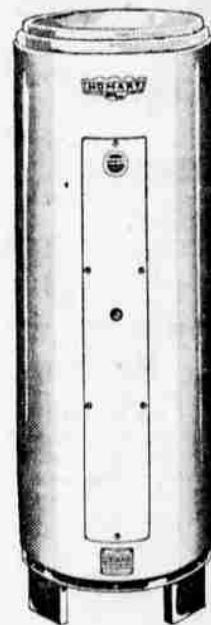
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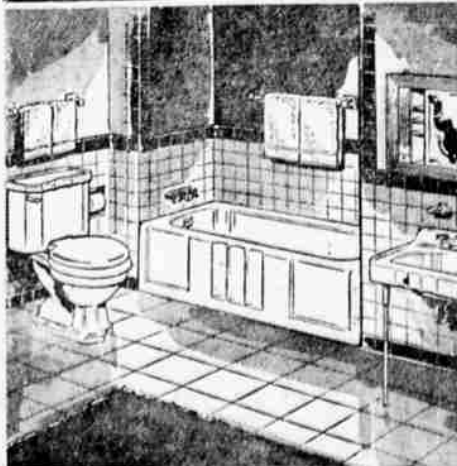


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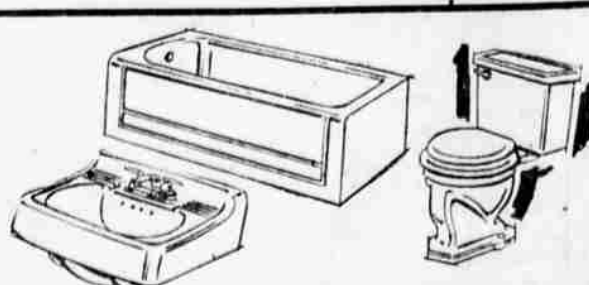


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
