Dr. Wendell L. Van Loan of association and of Dr. Van Loan, the father of two sons, are invited. Gov. Brown Proposes Loan For Dam

SACRAMENTO (UPI) — Gov. Edmund G. Brown today proposed that the state of California loan \$1 million from its \$1.75 billion water bond to the federal government to start preconstruction planning on the San Luis dam and reservoir. He also made public plans for a water conference between local, state and federal agencies to start water activities. California voters Tuesday approved the huge bond issue, probably the largest in history for any state, to construct a gigantic spiderweb of canals to take water from Northern California to the thirsty southern part of the state. At his first news conference since the election and his last one before a trip to South America which starts this weekend Brown suggested the \$1 million loan to the federal government to expedite construction of the multi-million dollar San Luis Project, a keystone in California's water plan. He said the loan had been approved by the legislature "under certain circumstances" and would speed San Luis by at least a year. Congress last year approved San Luis but has not yet appropriated money for its construction. The water project probably qualified as the greatest water development program conceived by modern man and its only rival was the ancient taming of the Nile River. It represented a state debt of about \$300 for every man, woman and child in the state.
