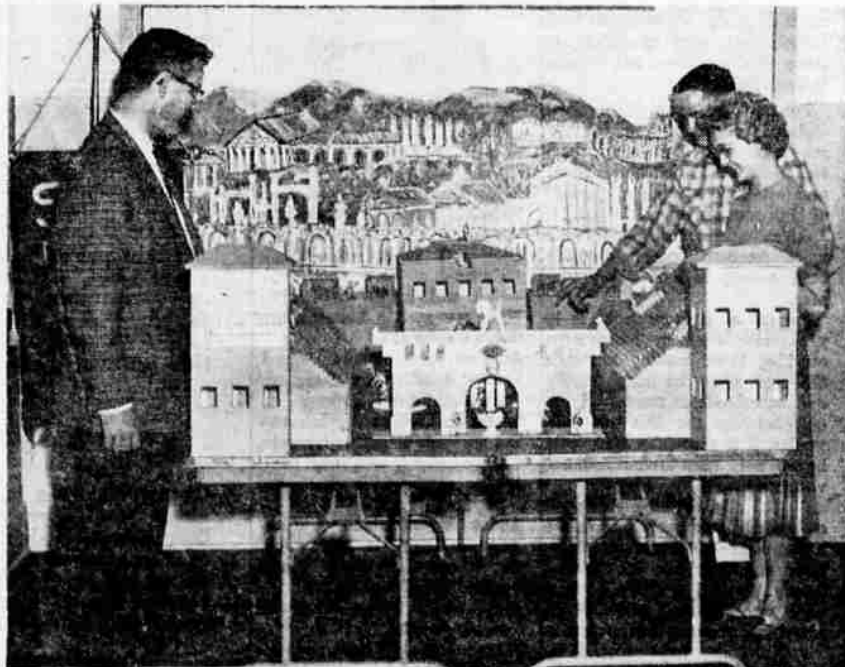

ADVANCED PHYSICAL SCIENCE is another feature at KUHS emphasized during American Education Week. This course has been a part of the KUHS curriculum for the past ten years. The laboratory approach stressed in this course gives a definite advantage to students going on in advanced work in science, engineering, medicine, nursing and other related fields. Other areas covered in this course besides qualitative chemistry, are units in quantitative and organic chemistry, astronomy and geology. In order to enroll in this advanced class, the student must have completed a year of general chemistry with better than average grades.



A MODEL of a Roman theater is being shown here in connection with the teaching of senior English. Senior students Jim Scapple, and Rao Rotrock, right, hold the model while instructor Louis Corrigan points out some details. During the year as part of a course in literature, lectures on the history of the theater are presented. These lectures, which emphasize chiefly Shakespeare precede a series covering Macbeth and Othello. The English department at KUHS offers a comprehensive four - year course in English. The subject matter covers the broad areas of speech, composition and literature.
