**700 Oregon Officials Will Attend Annual League Meeting**

More than 700 officials of Oregon cities are expected to attend the 35th annual convention of the League of Oregon Cities to be held in Salem at the Marion Hotel, Nov. 13-16, according to John W. Snider, league president, and mayor of Medford.

Participating in the convention from Klamath Falls will be Mayor Lawrence E. Slater, vice president of the league, who will preside at the Monday luncheon; Verne Schortgen, building inspector, who will participate in a discussion on "The Building Official and Zoning Administration" at the building regulations section Monday afternoon; and George Price, superintendent of parks and recreation, who will serve on a panel discussing planning and implementing facility development at the parks, recreation, and planning section Monday afternoon.

An orientation session for newly elected city officials will be held on Sunday afternoon, Nov. 13. Officials elected Nov. 8 to take office in January have been invited to participate in the orientation session to be devoted to basic legislative and administrative responsibilities of elected city officials.  
 In addition to the general sessions, problems anticipated during the next decade as well as accomplishment of the past year will be discussed in special section meetings for technical groups. These include city recorders, city attorneys, municipal judges, police chiefs, building inspectors, public works officials, and park and recreation officials.  
 Special guests taking part in the convention program include Dr. Frank L. Kidner, University of California business economist, who will deliver the keynote address at the opening general session Monday; Gen. P. T. Preuss, assistant director of the Federal Aviation Agency, Washington, D.C.

ho will speak at the Monday luncheon on "Supersonic Transport of the Future"; Walter P. Lyke, director of the Linfield Research Center, who will be the main speaker at the Tuesday luncheon; and Dr. John M. Swarthout, dean of faculty at Portland State College, who will address the annual banquet Tuesday evening.

Other featured speakers include Frank P. Zeidler, former mayor of Milwaukee, Wisconsin; Freeman Joimer, director of the state department of finance and administration; Chester A. Moores, industrial consultant with the state department of planning and development; and Circuit Judge Virgil H.

Langtry of Multnomah County. A number of state and federal officials working in fields related to municipal government will participate as convention consultants. The annual business meeting and the convention will close with election of officers on Wednesday and an "Off-the-Record" breakfast and morning, Nov. 16.
