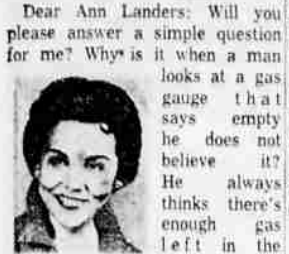


King-Sized Egos Not Always Smart

Fire Is Set In Y Building

EUGENE (AP)—A deliberately set fire damaged the Central Lane YMCA-YWCA in Eugene early Sunday.

John Morgan, general secretary of the organization, estimated the damage at \$75,000. The loss was confined to the two-story front wing where the administrative offices are located. The building cost \$325,000 when constructed in 1955.

Fire Marshal Lester Barker said someone spread towels along walls and hallways and then tried to set them afire. He said only those in the front wing burst into flames.

A passerby noticed smoke at 5:15 a.m. It took firemen two hours to control the blaze.

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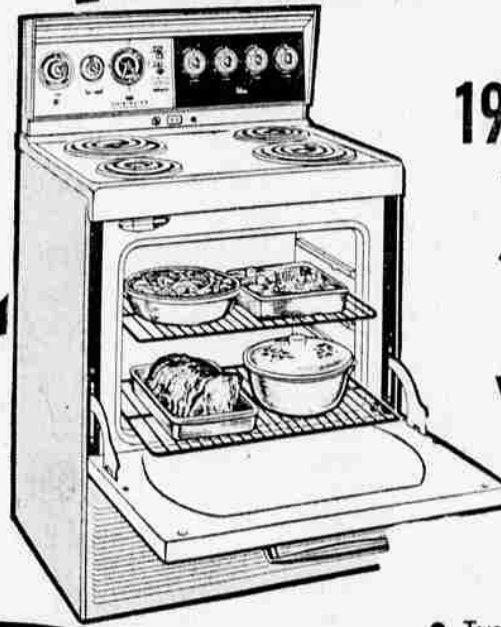
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Morse Says US Shouldn't Back Chiang In War

WASHINGTON (UPI) — Sen. Wayne Morse, D-Ore., says the United States should make it clear that this country would not support Chiang Kai-shek in any threat to make war in Asia.

"At the same time," Morse said Sunday night, "we must make clear... that we're not going to permit Red China to pull a Communist bloodbath on Formosa."

Morse, a member of the Senate Foreign Relations Committee and a U. S. delegate to the U. N. General Assembly, denounced Chiang's recent declaration that he would retake the mainland of China within three to five years.

The senator said President Eisenhower should have announced immediately that the United States was "no part of any such threat, because that's a proposal for war."

"Everyone in the world knows that Chiang couldn't take the mainland of China without the support of the 7th Fleet and American military forces," Morse said, "and I was shocked that Chiang was allowed to get by with it."

CLAIMS JET RECORD

CHICAGO (UPI)—Trans World Airlines today claimed one of its Boeing 707 jetliners piloted by Capt. Buddy Hagins, Los Angeles, Sunday set a new commercial Los Angeles-to-Chicago record of two hours, 49 minutes—four minutes less than the previous record.

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
