

260 Acres To Be Seeded Into Trees In Klamath

SALEM (Special)—The state reforestation program for the coming winter contemplates the planting of some five and one-half million trees and the seeding of some 11,350 pounds of Douglas fir seed on state forest lands managed by the state forestry department throughout Oregon. It is anticipated that this project will cost in the neighborhood of \$265,000.

Company Wins Damage Action

OREGON CITY (AP) — The Northwest Ice and Cold Storage Co. won \$200,000 in damages from Multnomah County Monday.

A Clackamas County circuit court jury found in favor of the firm, which contended that construction of the new Morrison Bridge in Portland several years ago blocked its loading dock. The company said that as a result the site will have to be abandoned.

The case was assigned for trial here after the firm said a Multnomah County jury might be prejudiced.

of tree seed are being aerial seeded in the area. Around 3,895,000 of these seedlings will be planted by crews under the direction of state forestry department personnel and a 60-man parolee crew which is available through agreement with the state penitentiary. The bulk of the tree seed and about 780,000 tree seedlings will be planted in the burn under private contract.

The remaining 825,000 tree seedlings and 1,850 pounds of tree seed will be used to reforest old burns and recent cutover areas on state lands in eight different counties. State forest lands in Clatsop County amounting to some 887 acres will be planted to Douglas fir and spruce tree seedlings; an additional 310 acres will be seeded to Douglas fir while 36 acres will be planted with 16,000 tree seedlings.

Lane County state lands will receive some 35,990 seedlings on 40 acres. About 190 acres will also be seeded. In Lincoln County state forest lands amounting to 275 acres will be planted to 240,000 tree seedlings. The following state lands will also be reforested: Marion, 45 acres to 35,000 seedlings; Klamath, 260 acres to 11,000 ponderosa pine, and Deschutes, 50 acres and 27,000 trees.
