\$2,500 Bail Set In Case At Dorris, Girl Testifies

DORRIS—During a preliminary hearing in Dorris Justice Court Monday for Paul Amos Cox, 24, Portland, who is charged with statutory rape, Judge Les Chase set bail at \$2,500 and bound Cox over to Siskiyou County Superior Court.

The 17-year-old Klamath Falls girl he is accused of assaulting testified against the youth. Under questioning by District Attorney Albert H. Newton Jr., the girl said Cox told her he was a friend of her brother's and invited her to sit in his car "to get acquainted" during a dance in Dorris Sept. 17.

She said she agreed, and when seated, he drove north on Highway 97 over Dorris Hill, then turned off onto a country road and stopped.

The girl said Cox made advances and she resisted. He threatened to kill her if she refused to submit to him, she said. Cox then assaulted her, she said.

Under cross examination by Assistant Public Defender Charles Hurley, the girl gave the same story. Cox did not take the stand.

Judge Chase ruled evidence was ample and remanded the defendant to Sheriff A. B. Cottar.

Shortly after the alleged assault, Cox broke away from special officer Russell Shoemaker and ran into the railroad yards at Dorris, while Shoemaker attempted arrest. Shoemaker said he fired a shot over his head to halt him.

Police Chief Byard Kelly and

an assistant took the defendant in the city police car to jail. When they opened the door to let him out, Cox dashed around the city hall and escaped.

A few days later, authorities in Phoenix, Ariz., notified the sheriff they were holding Cox.

The youth refused to waive extradition. The sheriff's department filed extradition proceedings and returned Cox, who has been held pending legal action in the county jail.

Chiefs Request Easier Arrests

SALEM (AP)—The Oregon Association of Chiefs of Police Tuesday went on record supporting legislation proposed by the legislature's highway interim committee that would ease arrest procedures for violation of state traffic regulations.

The group met at the League of Oregon Cities convention which ended Wednesday.

Art Ellsworth, Eugene, was named the group's new president. He succeeds Vernon Murdock Jr., Roseburg.
