

### No Deportation Date Is Set

The Immigration Service said today no new date has been set for the deportation of Hamish Scott MacKay and William A. Mackie of Portland, Ore.

The government has been trying to deport the two men for years, contending they were members of the Communist Party in the 1930s. The two men have denied it. Their latest move to avoid deportation failed Monday when the U. S. Supreme Court rejected an appeal for a stay. Their attorney later said President-elect John F. Kennedy had been asked to intervene.

### Democrats Will Meet On Sunday

PORTLAND (AP) — State Sen. Robert W. Straub of Eugene said today Democratic members of the next Legislature will meet Sunday in Salem.

Straub, chairman of the Oregon Democratic Party, said the legislators will discuss organization of the Senate and House and bills expected to be presented to the next session.

Democrats hold a majority in both houses.

MacKay is a carpenter. The government wants to deport him to Canada. Mackie is a house painter. The Immigration Service wants to send him to Finland.

### DAMAGED IN FLIGHT

TALLAHASSEE, Fla. (UPI) — Samples of bread mold carried by an Argo D-8 rocket 1,200 miles into space Sept. 19 showed serious cell damage. Florida State University scientist A. Gib Debusk said preliminary experiments indicate some other factor besides radiation caused some of the cell damage.

### 11 States Will Hold Vote Power

WASHINGTON (UPI) — The reapportionment of House seats gives 11 states power to elect a president in 1964, no matter how the other 39 vote.

The next election will be the first since 1880 which could be won by carrying fewer than a dozen states. A minimum of 12 states was needed to put together the winning majority of electoral votes in last Tuesday's election. House seats were reallocated among the states Tuesday to reflect population changes since the last census was taken 10 years ago. Nine states gained and 16 lost in the reshuffle.

Here are the 11 states and their 1964 electoral votes which total 268, a bare majority of the 535 that will be needed to win.

New York, 43; California, 40; Pennsylvania, 29; Illinois, 26; Ohio, 26; Texas, 25; Michigan, 21; New Jersey, 17; Massachusetts and Florida, 14; and either Indiana or North Carolina, 13.
