

Union Official Convicted Of Bribery Dies In Seattle

SEATTLE (AP) — Frank M. penters' Union officials convicted highway scandals, died here Chapman, one of three top Car-of bribery last month in Indiana's Wednesday. He was 55.

Chapman, corpulent general treasurer of the union, had been ill for many months. He reportedly was suffering from cancer, heart disease and diabetes.

His family here confirmed that he had died, but refused any further information.

Chapman, Maurice Hutcheson, president of the \$50,000-member union, and William Blaier, vice president, were convicted in Indianapolis Oct. 28 of bribing Harry A. Doggett for tips on highway right-of-ways in Indiana.

The three were accused of giving

ing Doggett, a former right-of-way buyer, \$15,000 for the information which enabled them to make a quick \$81,000 profit in land speculation.

Criminal Court Judge M. Walter Bell set Nov. 28 for sentencing Chapman's attorney had asked a suspended sentence for his client because of his poor health. Counsel for Hutcheson and Blaier said he would seek a new trial.

The prosecutor's office in Indianapolis said Thursday any fine against Chapman would not be levied against his estate.

UNIVERSITY OF OREGON, Eugene — Two nationally recognized men, in science and education, will be the featured speakers at the University of Oregon-sponsored Pacific Northwest Assembly on Dec. 1-4.

Dr. Alan Waterman, director of the National Science Foundation in Washington, D.C., and Dr. John D. Millett, president of Miami University, Oxford, Ohio, have accepted invitations to speak at the assembly, which will include prominent Northwest figures in business, labor, education, industry, religion and government.

The four-day assembly, a regional projection of the American Assembly of Columbia University, will convene at a 1 p.m. luncheon on Thursday, Dec. 1. From then until the assembly adjourns on Dec. 4, the participants will discuss various phases of the government's role in higher education. Heading up the university committee which has planned the P.N.W. Assembly is a professor, Dr. Wood is a professor of speech here. Dr. William C. Jones, acting president of the university, will be assembly chairman. Committee members include Dean Harry Alpert of the graduate school, Dean Robert D. Clark of the college of liberal arts, Dean Paul B. Jacobson of the school of education, James M. Shea, director of development and public services, and Dean Charles T.
