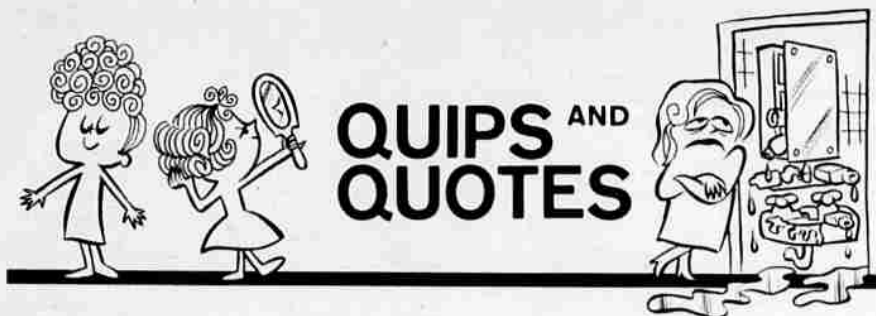




Permanent Damage
