Senatorial Candidates Top Expenditure List

SALEM (AP) — The total contributions and expenditures in the general election campaign showed today that those of the two senatorial candidates and the billboard regulation opponents topped all others.

The Oregon Council of Outdoor Advertising and the Council of Highway Regulation jointly reported contributions of \$107,967 and expenditures of \$106,129. These organizations led the successful attempt to defeat the bill to ban billboards on freeways.

The campaign committee for Sen. Maurine Neuberger, a Democrat, reported the second highest totals—expenditures of \$96,206 and contributions of \$96,208.

Republican Elmo Smith's campaign committee reported spending \$84,612 and contributions of \$89,944. Mrs. Neuberger defeated him.

The next greatest campaign total was for Secretary of State Howell Appling Jr., a Republican who defeated Democrat Monroe Sweetland.

The Appling committee reported receipts of \$47,368 and expenditures of \$49,843. Sweetland's committee said it received \$20,817 and spent \$22,361.

In the race for attorney general, the committee for Atty. Gen. Robert Y. Thornton, Democrat who won reelection, said it received \$5,526 and spent \$5,719. The committee for his opponent, Republican Carl Francis, reported receipts of \$11,581 and expenditure of \$11,354.

These reports by the candidates' committees were filed to meet a Friday deadline. The candidates themselves have until Wednesday to report their personal spending.

In the race for state treasurer, Republican Howard Belton's committee reported contributions of \$11,581 and expenditures of \$11,354. The report of his defeated opponent, Ward Cook, was not available.

In congressional races, the com-

mittee for Rep.-elect Edwin R. Durno of Medford in the 4th District reported contributions of \$36,089 and expenditures of \$36,098. His defeated opponent, Rep. Charles O. Porter, said his committee received \$20,761 and spent \$20,780.

In the 1st District, the campaign group for Rep. Walter Norblad, Republican who won reelection, reported receipts of \$8,562 and expenditures of \$14,506. The committee for Democrat Mary Owens, Norblad's defeated opponent, said it received \$206 and spent \$356.

The committee for the 3rd District winner, Rep. Edith Green, Democrat, reported receiving \$7,420 and spending \$4,871. The report of her opponent, Wallace Lee, has not been made available.

The figures for the 2nd District race, where Rep. Al Ullman, Democrat, defeated Ron Phair, were not available today.

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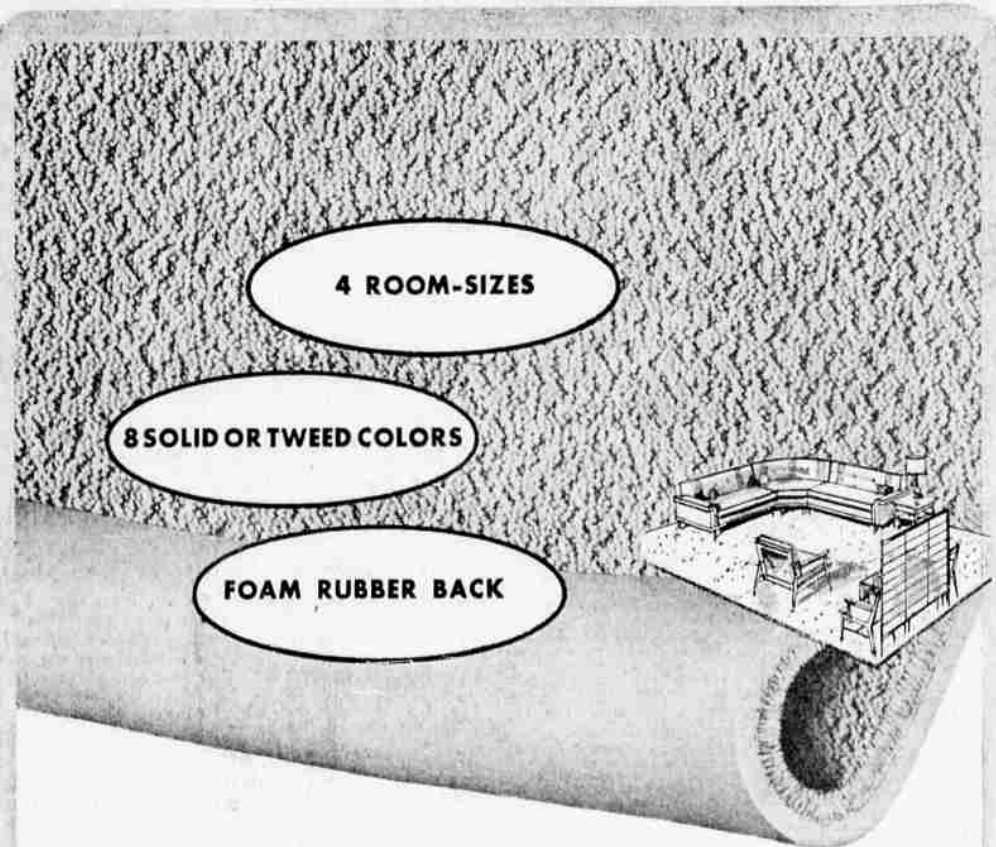

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
