

Chocolate Tart

Few cooks in this country, what with all the short cuts available for preparing meals, would bother to weigh ingredients to use in baking a cake. This one is printed only to give an idea of how cooks half a world away get ready to pop a cake in the oven.

Here is a deliciously moist chocolate cake that is as unorthodox in its composition as in the way it is prepared. It calls for household scales and potato starch—two items not always readily available. What's further uncommon about it, is that the weight of the eggs determines that of the other ingredients.

FOR THE CAKE:

4 eggs
unsweetened chocolate, the equivalent weight of 3 eggs
sugar, the equivalent weight of 2 eggs
butter, the equivalent weight of 2 eggs
potato starch, the equivalent weight of 1 egg

Separate the four eggs. Cream together sugar and egg yolks until light and fluffy. Add the chocolate, dissolved in ever so little boiling water. Stir in the softened butter, then the potato starch. Beat the egg whites until peaks form and fold them lightly into the chocolate mixture (it is best to do this in two portions). Pour into a buttered tin and bake in a moderate oven until a fork comes out clean. (Our recipe gives neither the exact temperature nor the baking time.) Cool. Frost with your favorite chocolate icing, or: melt 4 squares of unsweetened chocolate. Combine ¼ cup granulated sugar with ¼ cup water and heat to boiling. Add to chocolate, beating constantly. Frost cake at once.

CARAMEL PEACHES

Delight the youngsters with this quick dessert. Arrange canned cling peach halves in shallow baking dish. Fill each peach cup with 2 or 3 soft caramels. Heat in slow oven until candies melt. Top each peach with whipped cream and serve warm.

DRESS UP THE SALAD

Dress up your next cottage cheese and fruit salad by adding nut meats and fresh California dates. Simply fold the nuts and sun-mellowed chopping dates into cottage cheese along with a little lemon rind to accent the flavors.

TEA-TIME TREAT

Here's a dainty tea sandwich: Whip 1 (3-ounce) package softened cream cheese with a little milk and fold in ½ cup halved and pitted Flame Tokay grapes. Use to fill orange or nut tea bread sandwiches; cut in quarters diagonally and top each triangle with a dab of the filling and a grape half.

Dessert-Coffee
Fancy Affair

A simple and gracious way to entertain friends is to invite them over for dessert and coffee. On such occasions, dessert should be something a little special, served on your prettiest china plates. Paper-thin potato pancakes, layered with strawberries, and sprinkled with confectioners' sugar make a truly unusual and delicious dessert that will win compliments.

This American version of French "crepes" utilizes two convenience foods that you probably have right on hand, instant whipped potato flakes and frozen berries. The batter for the pan-

cakes is very easy to make with instant whipped potato flakes. Just combine one envelope of them with water, mix well and let stand for a minute. Then beat in the other ingredients and spoon the mixture onto a lightly greased hot griddle. If you have some kirsch or cointreau liqueur in the cabinet, try adding a quarter of a cup to the strawberries for a wonderfully different flavor. One last tip—sprinkle the sugar on top just a moment before serving as it melts away quickly.

DESSERT PANCAKES
(Makes 8-10 servings)

1 envelope (2½ cups) instant
Whipped Potato Flakes
1 cup water
3 eggs, slightly beaten
1½ cups milk
2 tablespoons butter, melted
2 tablespoons sifted flour
1 teaspoon salt
1 teaspoon baking powder
3 tablespoons sugar
2 packages (10-ounce) frozen strawberries, thawed
¼ cup kirsch or cointreau liqueur (optional)

Ahead of time, defrost frozen strawberries in bowl with ¼ cup kirsch or cointreau liqueur. Combine instant Whipped Potato Flakes and water; mix well. Let stand about one minute. Beat in eggs, milk and melted butter. Sift dry ingredients together and add

to potato mixture. Stir until blended. If necessary, grease hot griddle lightly. Pour batter from tip of large spoon onto griddle in little pools about one-inch apart. Turn pancakes as soon as they are puffed and full of bubbles. Brown on other side. Keep pancakes hot by placing between

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
