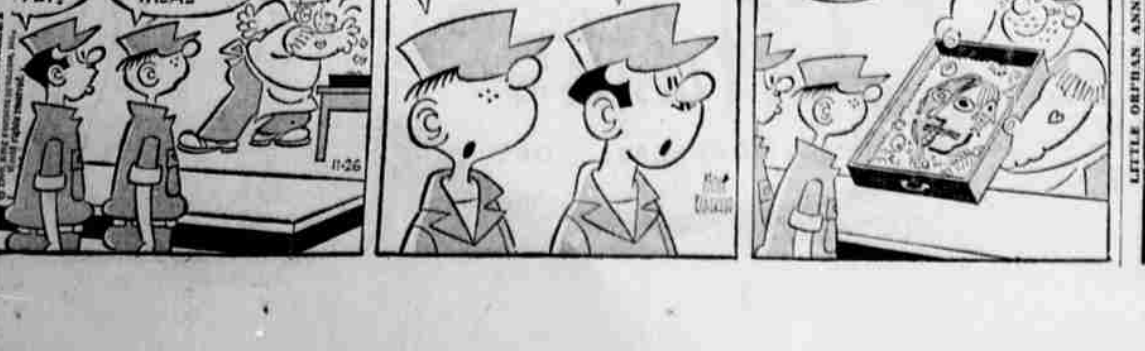
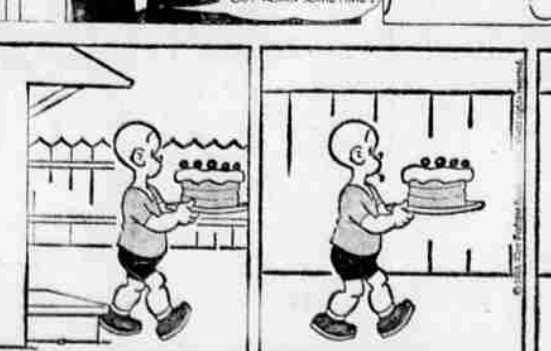
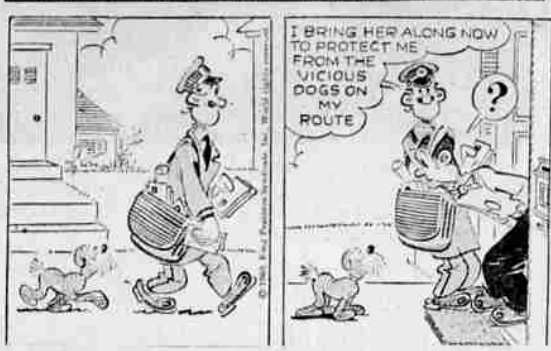
Mrs. Glen Ferguson, who has just taken over the presidency of the Juniper Garden Club, presided at the meeting.
