

Sugar Ray, Fuller Bout Featured

The complex career of Sugar Ray Robinson reaches a high note in today's Saturday night when the fading Harlem dandy battles the fender Gene Fullmer for the NBA middleweight championship at Los Angeles. The 15-rounder will be telecast nationally ABC 10 p.m. EST.

It was the NBA which stripped Robinson of title recognition last year for failure to defend the championship within proper time.

But the 40-year-old ex-champ leaped at the chance for the NBA version of the title when he blew the New York-Massachusetts title to Paul Pender last January. The Cambridge, Mass., fireman-fighter repeated over Sugar Ray in June, marking the first time in his 20-year pro ring career that Robinson had lost two fights in succession.

Fullmer, who had won and lost with Robinson in two fully recognized world title fights, gained NBA recognition as champ by stopping Carmen Basilio in the 14th round.

The muscular champion from West Jordan, Utah, upset Robinson on a 15-round decision in their first clash on Jan. 2, 1957. Four months later Robinson knocked out Fullmer with one punch in the fifth round to win the title for the fourth time.

Now Robinson is trying to get the title, or a piece of it, for the sixth time. Fullmer, winner of 13 straight, is the 12-5 favorite.

Light heavyweight champion Archie Moore, another old guy who lost NBA recognition, tries to start another victory streak at Dallas tonight. The 44-plus Cal-Matchmaker Teddy Brenner said he would try to make the

fight after watching the blood-smeared De John blitz Hunter in 2:51 of the ninth round of the 10-round television battle of heavy-weight contenders. It was a close fight up to the knockout.

Unbeaten Luis Rodriguez, top-ranking welter contender from Havana, opposes veteran Johnny Gonzales of Oakland at San Francisco tonight.

Ralph Dupas, perennial welter contender from New Orleans, faces Argentina's Antonio Marcella in a ten-rounder at New Orleans Friday night.

Mike DeJohn's ninth-round knockout of Billy Hunter Saturday night at Madison Square Garden, probably earned the hard-hitting Syracuse, N.Y., heavyweight a February television fight with Eddie Machon of Portland, Ore.
