



Yugoslavia Gets Credit

VIENNA (AP) — Austria has joined the United States and other Western countries in granting Communist Yugoslavia substantial dollar credits to bolster its economy, Yugoslav Foreign Minister Koca Popovic said Saturday.

Popovic told a news conference at the end of a three-day meeting with Austrian government leaders that the credit would be used to help Yugoslavia carry out currency reform aimed at liberalizing trade relations with the West.

He said the credit volume would have to be agreed upon in further negotiations. It is known here, however, that Yugoslavia is seeking \$10 million from Austria.

Popovic said his talks with Chancellor Julius Raab and Foreign Minister Bruno Kreisky resulted in the "mutual understanding that Austria and Yugoslavia, on the basis of common views, should strive toward cooperation in the international field, particularly in the United Nations."

Kidnap Case Becomes 615th Since Federal Law

WASHINGTON (UPI) — The Anthony Alessio kidnapping solved Friday by the FBI was the 615th major abduction since the crime became a federal offense in 1932. The FBI has solved all but four.

Congress passed the federal kidnapping statute on June 22, 1932, after a wave of public indignation which erupted out of the famous Charles A. Lindbergh Jr. case.

Lindbergh, son of America's aviation hero, was taken on March 1, 1932, at Hopewell, N.J., and \$50,000 ransom was paid. The baby was murdered.

The \$650,000 asked by Alessio kidnappers was the highest ever demanded, according to FBI files.

Highest Ransom
The highest sum ever paid was \$600,000 demanded by the kidnapers of Robert Cosgrove Green-lease Jr., son of a wealthy Kansas City car dealer. Young Green-lease was murdered. The FBI solved the case and recovered \$300,000 of the ransom.

Alessio's family paid \$200,000 for his release after bartering with the kidnapers. That sum has been paid three previous times, and all three times the money was partially recovered and the victims released.

On July 22, 1933, \$200,000 was paid the kidnapers of Charles F. Urschel, a wealthy oil man from Oklahoma City, Okla. Urschel was released, the FBI solved the case and recovered \$123,700 of the ransom money.

West Coast lumber magnate George Weyerhaeuser, kidnapped May 24, 1935, from Tacoma, Wash., was released after \$200,000 was paid kidnapers. A \$157,000 sum was recovered after the case was solved.

Bremer Case
The 1934 Edward George Bremer case was solved by FBI agents after the St. Paul, Minn., banker was freed. The FBI recovered \$19,870 of the \$200,000 ransom.

Of the four unsolved kidnappings, the FBI ranks two as major. The major kidnappings included:

The kidnapping of 12-year-old Peter David Levine, son of New York Attorney Murray Levine, on Feb. 24, 1938. The boy was taken from his home while playing with three other children on Dec. 29, 1936. To date, the FBI has investigated 12,800 persons. Another 125 persons are still under investigation. Mattson was found beaten to death on Jan. 11, 1937, six miles south of Everett, Wash.

Two other cases rank among the highest in ransoms paid. These were:

William A. Hamm, kidnapped June 15, 1933, from St. Paul, Minn. He was released after \$100,000 was paid. The FBI recovered \$5,000 and solved the case.

Charles S. Ross, a Chicago businessman, was kidnapped Sept. 23, 1937, and murdered by his abductors. The case was solved after \$50,000 ransom was paid.

Mattson Case
Ten-year-old Charles Fletcher Mattson, son of Dr. W. W. Mattson of Tacoma, Wash., was taken from his home while playing with three other children on Dec. 29, 1936. To date, the FBI has investigated 12,800 persons. Another 125 persons are still under investigation. Mattson was found beaten to death on Jan. 11, 1937, six miles south of Everett, Wash.

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Royal Pair Decorate Hideaway

LONDON (AP) — Queen Elizabeth II and Prince Philip have created a hideaway in Windsor Castle, with every rug, chair, wall decoration and piece of furniture right out of today's show windows.

The queen and her husband, it was disclosed Saturday, decided to create a suite in the Kind Edward III Tower that would completely reflect life in 1960. Even the paintings are modern.

They planned the five-room apartment, supervised the drawings and purchases and completed the work before permitting any information to leak out.

Details of the venture were revealed in the magazine Design, published by the Council of Industrial Design.

The modern suite is for family use only and will not be open to tourists. Large sections of Windsor are seen by thousands of tourists annually at times when the queen is not in residence.

The royal couple commissioned Sir Hugh and Lady Casson to prepare the layout, making the one apartment typical of these times. Others are of the past.

In furnishing the suite, the queen drew on the ideas of prominent designers but also accepted some standard brands from manufactured stock.

We Will Fight, Warns Premier

VIENTIANE, Laos (AP) — Premier Prince Souvanna Phouma charged foreign interference has created a dangerous situation in Laos and he warned that if peace negotiations fail "we will fight."

The neutralist premier told a cheering rally of 2,000 people "the important thing is that this government must survive."

"If it does not, there will be open war" between the pro-Communist Pathet Lao and the rightist rebel regime of Gen. Phoumi Nosavan in Savannakhet, he said.

"We must not let our country become a battle ground between East and West," he said as the crowd roared approval.

The premier, who is taking up relations with the Soviet Union and Communist North Viet Nam, wants the United States to drop all aid to Nosavan, former defense minister, now that his troops are revolting against the central regime. The United States has financed the whole of Laos' army.

Herter Pledges Korea Support

SEOUL, South Korea (AP) — Secretary of State Christian A. Herter has pledged a continued support of the U.S. government for the new government of South Korea Premier John M. Chang.

This was contained in a letter delivered by Ambassador Walter P. McCaughy, who called at the premier's office Saturday.

Herter praised the Korean people for their attitude during the April revolution which overthrew the authoritarian government of Syngman Rhee.

"The atmosphere of calm and resolution which has characterized the adoption of your new system of government and the subsequent general elections augurs well for the realization, in practical terms, of the popular aspirations which were reflected in the events of last March and April," Herter wrote.
