

Farm Group To Counter Labor Plan

Representatives of state-wide commodity organizations have been invited to meet at the Farm Bureau Building in Salem on Dec. 2 to discuss plans for formation of an agricultural association to cope with the threatened organization of farm labor in the state.

A steering committee named at a recent meeting of 13 state-wide commodity organizations will report their recommendations for consideration including the type of organization to be developed, the need for legal assistance and the method for coordinating a state-wide program of activities.

Riddell Lage, Hood River, was named chairman of the group at the initial meeting in October. Lage is a member of the national advisory committee on agricultural labor.

Lage said the move toward a closed shop for agricultural workers by the Agricultural Workers Organization Committee could become a grave danger to the vast production of Oregon crops and is a matter all farmers must consider immediately. He pointed out the teamsters union has announced it will issue charters for locals of agricultural employees. They are apparently interested in permanent farm employees and will organize tractor and truck drivers as well as operators of combines, balers, and other specialized equipment.

Teamsters are presently working to organize the Washington apple industry and have called for a boycott of apples produced in Washington.

Lage called on every segment of Oregon agriculture to work together on a solid agricultural front with a well planned program and said the Dec. 2 meeting will be the first step toward activating that program.

The Oregon Farm Bureau Board of Directors also met on Nov. 28 and President Gerald Detenbeck has stated the two-day business session was concerned also with the labor problem in Oregon. The Oregon Farm Bureau has already formed a labor committee with local committees in each county in the state.

Postmaster Repeats Mail Early Plea

Postmaster Chet Langset said today, "Early mailing of all Christmas cards and gifts is the biggest single factor in getting all of the mail delivered before Christmas and everything is geared up to handle a record Christmas mail."

The entire Christmas mailing period is a big battle against time. Even though Christmas is a month away by the calendar, it's Christmas every day at the post office from now on.

The postmaster advises, "Don't take chances on mailing poorly wrapped packages. Use sturdy corrugated mailing cartons, plenty of heavy wrapping paper and strong cord. Cartons containing

several gift packages should be well stuffed with tissue or old newspapers to cushion the contents."

He said further, "If you have articles of unusual size or bulk, better check with the post office before attempting to mail them. The limits of size and weight of packages vary, depending on where you mail your packages to or from."

Always send your Christmas cards by first class mail and be sure to include your return name and address on each Christmas card envelope.

Send all Christmas mail going long distances before Dec. 16. Follow up promptly with cards

and gifts for local delivery. Mail "Early and Often" for a merrier Christmas!
