Heavy Snow Delays Pipeline Work

Heavy snows in the Klamath Falls area have retarded clearing and ditching operations in the Alberta-California Gas Pipeline Project.

John R. Wells, superintendent of the Western Pipeline clearing crew, said 40 miles have been cleared of timber and brush. Seven miles have been ditched. Western Pipeline has about 70 men working in the area between Malin and Bonanza.

Wells said pipe laying operations would begin as soon as 20 miles had been ditched and blasted.
