Soviet Life Speaker's Topic

The American Association of University Women Monday lunch group appreciated an address on Nov. 21 by Tibor Kalman, formerly of Hungary, on "How People Live Behind the Iron Curtain." He showed how the tragic

Hungarian Revolution was the result of accumulating pressures that sapped the liberties of the people and reduced the country to a satellite of Soviet communism. Out of his own experience he described the seizure of private property, businesses and factories, the crushing of political parties and free elections, the operation of the spy system with trumped-up charges and speedy convictions, the enslavement of religion—in fact, the complete destruction of freedom.

Tibor Kalman, after one unsuccessful attempt at escape, finally managed to cross the border into safety. He came to the United States four years ago. Already a graduate in music at Budapest, he earned his M.A. degree at the University of Arizona, and is now teaching music in the schools of Tulelake.
