Bryant Lectures At OTI

Harry Bryant, associate physicist and training director at Idaho Division, Argonne National Laboratories, Idaho Falls, lectured to several classes at Oregon Technical Institute while he was on campus for two days recently.

Bryant was looking over the crop of students who will be graduated at the end of this semester. Of the 30 technical institute graduates employed at the laboratory, 11 are from OTI.

Bryant's subject included nuclear reactor instrumentation. He toured the electronics and nuclear science areas of the campus.

He has been active with the International School of Nuclear Science and Engineering, part of President Eisenhower's "Atoms for Peace" program, since 1955. He participated with the engineering division at the laboratory in developing the new family of educational-type atomic reactors, notably, the Argonaut.

He attended the Second International Conference for Peaceful Uses of Atomic Energy in Geneva in 1958 as technical adviser for the U.S. delegation.

Bly Man Serves Aboard Carrier

Jerry B. Henderson, nuclear weaponsman seaman, USN, son of Mr. and Mrs. S. L. Henderson of Bly, is serving aboard the attack aircraft carrier USS Lexington operating with the Seventh Fleet in the Western Pacific.

The carrier departed San Diego Nov. 1, and is scheduled to visit Guam, the Philippines, Hong Kong and Japan during the seven-month cruise.

Plane Crashes On Mercy Hop

RUTH (UPI) — A light plane taking off from a mountain airstrip on a mercy flight crashed seconds later Sunday night, killing all four occupants, including a seriously ill young woman.

Killed were pilot Edward Anderson, 26, and Walter Howard, 29, Andrew Gravlee, 27, from Tulare, and his wife, Florence, 20. The three men were flying Mrs. Gravlee, who had suffered a miscarriage, to Rhonerville Airport from where she could be taken to Redwood Memorial Hospital in the coastal fishing town of Fortuna.

Anderson and Howard were co-owners of Dinsmores Lodge, a resort in the Trinity Alps near here. The plane had just taken off from the lodge's airstrip when the accident occurred.

Federal aviation officials said the Cessna 170 cartwheelled along the ground and disintegrated. The plane and the four bodies were scattered over a 100-yard wide area.

Gravlee, a construction equipment operator, had been working on the Ruth Dam project.

REBELLION LULLS

VIETNAMESE, Laos (AP) — Right-wing rebel Gen. Phoumi Nosavan's forces have withdrawn 15 to 20 miles south of the Namkading River and a lull has settled on that crucial battlefield, according to authoritative reports today.

The lull revived hopes in Vietnamese for resumption of peace talks to end the three-sided Lao-Lao civil war.

Phoumi apparently has abandoned temporarily any plans he may have had for a march on the capital.

Accused Killer To Stand Trial

RENO (UPI) — Reno Police Chief Elmer Briscoe said Monday he thought Oklahoma convict Joseph Miles Walker, 34, could be returned here to stand trial for murder "within two weeks."

Briscoe and Washoe County District Attorney William Raggio returned here from McAlester, Okla., Sunday after obtaining an alleged confession from the Ogden, Utah, house painter that he allegedly murdered a California manufacturer on the outskirts of Reno last September.

Walker was serving a two-year prison sentence in Oklahoma for burglary under the assumed name of Lester Beatty. Briscoe said he was identified as the man wanted in connection with the slaying of Paul G. Allison, 29, through fingerprints.

Allison's beaten and stabbed body was found in the back of one of the camper trailers he manufactured in Santa Rosa, in a parking lot near Reno's skid row.

Briscoe said Walker told him he "lost his head" when he killed Allison. He also said he had been drinking before Allison picked him up between Reno and Salt Lake City.

Allison was returning to Santa Rosa from Montana when he disappeared.

Driver Faces Drunk Charges

City police charged Fred John Griebel, 1021 1/2 Washington Street, with drunk driving and disorderly conduct Saturday evening.

An off-duty officer said Griebel ran a red light at the corner of Seventh and Main streets, nearly striking his car. The officer said he followed the car to where Griebel stopped several blocks away.

He called for assistance. Officers said Griebel tried to fight them and used abusive language, so they charged him with disorderly conduct.

Griebel asked for time to consult an attorney in municipal court Monday. His case was continued.

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Nine Areas Have 'Substantial' Unemployment

WASHINGTON (UPI) — The Labor Department today classified nine more major industrial centers as areas of "substantial" unemployment, placing more than one-third of the nation's big factory communities in this category.

Fifty-one of the country's 150 main manufacturing areas now have substantial joblessness, meaning 6 per cent or more of the workers are unemployed. The department forecast a further rise in unemployment next month after a job increase just before Christmas.

The department's bi-monthly report also added eight smaller industrial areas to the substantial unemployment list, making a total of 123. One smaller center was dropped.

President-elect John F. Kennedy appointed a special committee Sunday to consider ways of helping such distressed areas.

Job cutbacks in steel, aircraft, aluminum and other durable goods manufacturing primarily were responsible for the new areas of substantial unemployment, the Labor Department said.

The report said the customary fall pickup in employment failed to materialize in some of the major industrial areas in October

and November and was below seasonal expectations in other centers. Unemployment increased in about 90 of the key factory areas in October and November, largely because of job layoffs in both durable and non-durable manufacturing. Some centers producing autos and auto parts reported manpower cutbacks after brisk employment gains earlier in the fall.

Employer hiring plans indicated a temporary employment rise just before Christmas, followed by perhaps a slightly more than seasonal decline in non-farm jobs by mid-January, the department said.

The nine major areas newly classified as substantial unemployment centers were Bridgeport and Waterbury, Conn., South Bend, Fort Wayne and Gary, Hammond-East Chicago, Ind.,

Spokane, Wash., Hamilton-Middleton, Ohio, Steubenville-Weirton, Ohio-W.Va., and San Bernardino-Riverside-Ontario, Calif. The smaller communities added to the list were Eureka and Ukiah, Calif., Pueblo, Colo., Ashtabula-Conneaut and Kent-Ravenna, Ohio, Bristol-John City-Kingsport, Tenn.-Va., Provo, Utah, and New Martinsville, W.Va.-Ohio. Rocky Mount, N. C., was dropped from the list.



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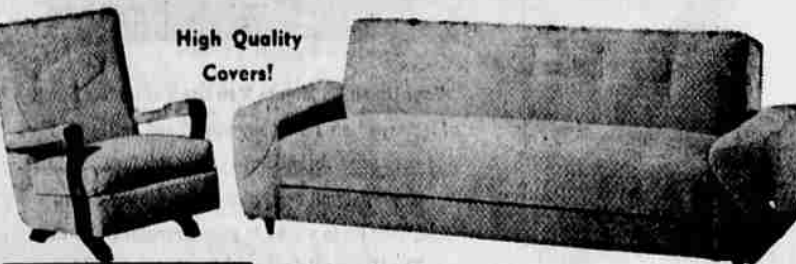
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
