

# Grisly Find Solution To Mystery

LONDON (AP)—The headless body of a woman and the foot and thigh bones of a man were dredged up out of the Thames Monday night and Tuesday, providing the first break in a mystery that has plagued Scotland Yard for four years.

Police said the headless corpse was "almost certainly" that of Mary Love, who vanished with her husband in 1896. The body floated to the surface Monday night after a diver scooped up a rusty, mud-caked automobile. This morning the man's bones were dredged up.

Jack and Mary Love drove away from their terraced house in the London suburb of Tottenham on Nov. 28, 1896. They were never seen again, although Mrs. Love, 57, left a note that they would be back in an hour. The car was a black Wolseley sedan. All that could be deciphered of the license number were the figures 30.

The Loves' car also was a black Wolseley, its license number was DP333.

Jack Love, ex-merchant navy officer, tall, wavy-haired and mustached, has been reported many times in the last four years. When detectives followed up the reports their inquiries always proved fruitless.

Fifty yards from where the car was found is the berth of Blue Star Line ship. Love worked for the line until the wife, 33 years his senior, put up—and lost—2,000 pounds—\$3,600—for him to start as a car dealer.

# J. Corbett Trial Set

GOLDEN, Colo., (AP)—Trial starts March 13 for 32-year-old Joseph Corbett Jr., charged with slaying Adolph Goetz III, wealthy Colorado brewer.

Corbett, arrested in Vancouver, N.C., Oct. 29, has pleaded innocent. During a 10-minute hearing Monday, Judge Christian Stoner set the trial date. The judge appointed H. Malcolm Mackay and William H. Erickson to defend Corbett, originally from Seattle.

Corbett told Judge Stoner he had no money, and the judge asked if his family could assist him.

"No," replied Corbett. "They are not financially able to help."

Corbett was chained with other prisoners for the trip from the county jail to the courthouse. The chains were removed before he was taken into the courtroom.

There were reports Corbett's attorneys might try to have the trial moved to another town.

Goetz, who was 44, disappeared soon after leaving his ranch home near Denver Feb. 9. The next day, Corbett, who lived in Denver several years as a writer, left his Denver apartment.

On Sept. 11, Goetz' remains and torn clothing were found in a mountain area southwest of Denver.

# BPA Officials Are Optimistic At Auditorium

SEATTLE (AP)—Officials of the Bonneville Power Administration see a bright future for power supplies in the Pacific Northwest in the next 10 years.

Their views came soon after John J. Burke, president of the Pacific Northwest Power Co., said in Washington, D. C., that unless another dam is built on the Snake River before 1970 the area faces a crippling power shortage.

Burke was trying to get the Federal Power Commission to authorize construction of High Mountain Sheep Dam.

The Bonneville officials said that in the years up to 1970 power should be sufficient under normal conditions. They said a proposed water storage treaty with Canada probably will add 1,600,000 kilowatts to production of United States power plants.

The use of heat from a new nuclear reactor at Hanford is also viewed as a reason for optimism. It would produce 700,000 kilowatts.

# One-Time Mayor To Be Teacher
