Education Heads List In New Oregon Budget

SALEM (AP)—Education is the biggest single item and gets more than one-third of the general fund in Gov. Mark Hatfield's proposed budget for the next biennium. Basic fund school support represented \$124,310,000, compared to \$107,632,268 in the current biennium, an increase of nearly \$17 million.

Hatfield's budget would boost the state's share of basic school support to \$115 per census child. This is 42 per cent.

The budget also contains \$22,331,804 for the Board of Higher Education. Of this, \$22,331,333 is from the general fund, an increase of \$4,488,550.

A factor in higher education costs is increased enrollment. The budget called for the same expenditures per student based on an expected 2.7 per cent increase in enrollment.

Other expenses: \$56,000 for a graduate school of social work at Portland State, \$313,000 for additional teachers, \$40,500 for more dormitory counseling personnel, \$493,904 for added office staff, \$163,539 for teaching supplies, \$185,514 for more library books, \$86,399 for new technical publications and \$163,610 for more operating supplies.

Also included were an increase of \$100,000 in research funds, \$48,000 more for plant rehabilitation and \$675,843 more for general purpose programming. There were no proposals for a raise in tuition or increased taxes.

Hatfield's budget estimated that scholarships already awarded will cost the state \$800,000 in the coming biennium and he recommended another \$75,000. The budget proposed increases for academic salaries in higher education of \$5,634,147 in the next two fiscal years, compared to \$2,551,934 during the current two years.

The salary increase was designed to regain and maintain the competitive position of Oregon institutions. The governor also proposed increases of \$50,000 for educational television, including enough to get a station started in Portland on Channel 10. This brought the total amount for educational television to \$786,530.
