Officers Seek Scalping Victim

VISALIA (UPI)— Sheriff's officers today were attempting to unravel the mystery of an apparent scalping north of Visalia. A piece of scalp, 2 1/2 by 5 inches in diameter, with black, coarse hair, and three blood-clotted garments were found by Mrs. Helen Ruiz last week behind her home. The clothing—a man's undershirt, sweat shirt and work shirt—was found in an outhouse and the scalp on the ground nearby. Investigators reported a check of local hospitals and doctors failed to turn up a scalping victim.

Economist Sees No 'Growth' Forces

WASHINGTON (AP)—A government economist told a congressional committee today "no major forces are in sight to provide the upward thrust needed for resumption of economic growth." The estimate came from Louis J. Paradiso, chief statistician in the Office of Business Economics of the Commerce Department, who said the basic indicators showed mixed movements—some up and some down. Paradiso was one of a panel of witnesses called before the Senate-House Economic Committee as it opened two days of hearings on the nation's economic outlook in the next few months. Another witness, Seymour L. Wolfbein, deputy assistant secretary of Labor, said the jobless total in the nation would reach 5,282,000 next February if October's 6.4 per cent rate of unemployment was maintained without change.

He emphasized he was making no prediction on the rate. Actual purchases of goods for final use in October was 3,579,000, and by rapid shifts in the pattern of inventory buying—from accumulation to holding the inventory line and then to liquidation."

Fire Nearly A Disaster

LOS ANGELES (UPI)—It was only a minor fire in a mattress, but for an elderly couple who didn't believe in banks it almost proved disastrous.

When firemen answered the call Tuesday at the home of Leslie Smoot, 73, and his wife, Rose, 60, they found the couple excitedly trying to collect their life savings of \$8,260 in bills and silver stowed in the mattress, in the pillow cases, in shoes and jars throughout the bedroom.

Firemen quickly doused the flames started by a short in a heating pad. The couple, operators of a small cafe, explained they were distrustful of banks since losing their savings during the depression of the 1930s.

44 Rescued

OSLO, Norway (UPI)— All 44 persons aboard the Norwegian tanker Havilde were rescued by other ships Wednesday night after a fire broke out. The vessel was reported still burning early today. "A few women" were among those rescued, the Havilde's owners said. The tanker was carrying diesel fuel from Aden to Dakar.
