Under good of the order, Master Masons were welcomed and introduced. Mrs. Daisy Judd, past matron of Palm Chapter in Los Angeles and a new resident of

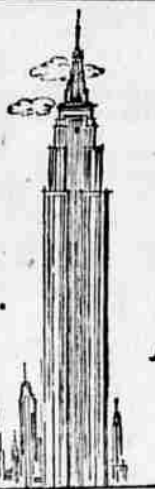

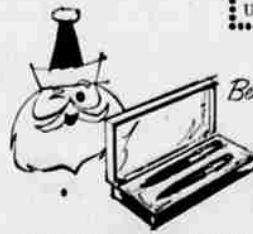
