

Charge Is Dismissed

Geraldine Cannady, 224 Broad Street, charged Marjorie Ann Walker, 30, 334 Delaware Street, with disorderly conduct Thursday but she couldn't make the charge stick in Municipal Court Friday morning.

Cop Is Fined For Arresting

VIENNA, Austria (AP)—When the policeman arrested the woman on a street corner, she cried in consternation: "But I am your wife."

"Never mind that," the policeman snapped. "You are under arrest for soliciting men."

A judge released the wife for lack of evidence and she marched straight to another court and filed two suits against her husband, one for libel and another for divorce.

The judge ruled the arrest was "prompted by jealousy rather than a sense of duty" and fined the cop 500 schilling—\$20.

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
