WASHINGTON (UPI) — The date was Dec. 8, 1941. The place, Pearl Harbor, Hawaii. The setting was deep inside the sunken battleship USS West Virginia. Three men were trapped in a compartment, untouched by the bombs and fire that ravaged the vessel and sent it to the floor of the harbor in the sneak Japanese attack the previous day. The sailors were spending the second of what was to be 16 days of a fruitless struggle to live. They breathed from an air bubble in the sealed storeroom. They fed on emergency rations. They tapped a freshwater tank for drink.
