

KU Jayvees, Hornets, Huskies Count Wins In B Cage Action

The Chiloquin Panther plans for revenge on the Henley Hornets went up in smoke in Chiloquin Tuesday night. The Hornets went home with a 52-44 victory, their second straight over the Chiloquin five. Last Friday the Hornets won on their home court.
