

Convict Admits Killing Florida Judge And Wife

WEST PALM BEACH, Fla. (AP)—Floyd A. Holzapfel, 36, an ex-convict, has pleaded guilty to the drowning of Circuit Judge Curtis E. Chillingworth and his wife, Marjorie, five years ago.

Judge Russell O. Morrow took the unusual action of hearing Holzapfel's case Monday without a jury and said he will hear additional testimony in Circuit Court on Feb. 20.

The judge warned the former college debater that he could be sentenced to death in the electric chair.

"I'm willing to stand up here and plead guilty and take my medicine," he replied.

Holzapfel confessed last month that he and a Negro, George Lincoln, kidnaped the veteran Judge Chillingworth, 56, and his wife from their home and drowned them on the night of June 14, 1955.

The former Oklahoma City man, who has a record of arrests for bookmaking, armed robbery and attempted rape, said he and Lincoln were paid \$2,000 for the kill.

Bodies of the Chillingworths were never recovered.

NEW YORK (UPI)—There is a unique club in this big city whose main purpose is to get rid of its members.

The members are all executives over 40 years of age, and out of work through no fault of their own, who have banded together to help each other get jobs.

The 40-Plus Club has helped more than 2,000 members find re-employment in industry and the professions the past 20 years.

While some members may find a job right away, most of them must be prepared to wait five or six months before the right job comes along.

This is where a man's savings come in, according to club president Wallace J. Stenhouse, for without them he could not sustain his family or carry on his club responsibilities.

Bonds For Dam 'Could Be Sold'

WASHINGTON (AP)—Bonds and securities to finance the \$37 million High Mountain Sheep Dam project could find a ready market, an investment banker told the Power Commission Tuesday.

Albert H. Gordon of Kidder, Peabody and Co., New York City, said the financing plan of Pacific Northwest Power Co. is sound and would result in the lowest power costs to consumers. He said the four companies making up PNP would pay the annual cost of the firm by taking the dam's entire power output.

PNP is seeking authority to build Mountain Sheep in the same general stretch of the Snake River, between Idaho and Oregon, in which Washington Public Power Supply System seeks a license to build Nes Perce Dam. Both can't be built.

Two Missiles Get Speed-Up

CAPE CANAVERAL, Fla. (UPI)—American military agencies have begun another speed-up in development of two of the nation's most ambitious ballistic missiles, the Army's Pershing and the Navy's Polaris.

The 34-foot Pershing flew 140 miles over the Atlantic Monday for its eighth success in nine shots and carried an inertial guidance system as a "passenger" for the first time. This indicated a fully guided shot, a Pershing "milestone," may be only a few weeks away.

On the Navy side of the cape, the nuclear submarine Robert E. Lee began check-outs for a series of at least four submerged firings of the Polaris off the Florida east coast within the next few weeks.

Kennedy Holds Slight Lead

WASHINGTON (UPI)—With complete election returns in from all 50 states and all but three states proclaiming their votes as official, Sen. John F. Kennedy today held a slim 113,828 margin over Vice President Richard M. Nixon.

The three states with complete but still unofficial counts were Illinois, Massachusetts and Rhode Island.

The unofficial tabulation by United Press International was: Kennedy — 34,223,837 (49.72 per cent); Nixon — 34,110,009 (49.53 per cent).

Others—406,044 (0.73 per cent) Total—68,533,790

Kennedy had 50.064 per cent of the two-party vote for President and Nixon had 49.916 per cent—a difference of 0.168 per cent. That was the narrowest percentage margin in history.

MINERS TRAPPED

ZONGULDAK, Turkey (AP)—Twelve miners were dead and 55 trapped far below ground Tuesday by a gas explosion in a coal mine near this Black Sea coast city.

School Budget At \$34 Million

PORTLAND (AP)—The Portland School Board has approved a budget for the coming year of \$34,350,000.

This calls for \$2,700,000 in additional taxes. The election on the tax levy has been tentatively set for March 8.

The budget includes provision for raising teachers' salaries at a cost of more than \$1 million. Also in the budget are funds for 30 kindergarten teachers.
