### Little Boy Dies Trying To Save A Toy Rabbit

SAN BERNARDINO, Calif. (UPI)—A 19-month-old boy lost his life Tuesday when he rushed into his burning bedroom to save his dearest possession—a toy rabbit. He died clutching the toy in his hands.

The blaze had been started by one of the boy's brothers who was playing with fire, firemen said.

Terry Lee Pruitt, his three brothers and one sister all were hurried from the room when their mother, Mrs. Lilly Pruitt, smelled smoke. She got the children outside and ran to a neighbor's to call firemen.

While Mrs. Pruitt was gone, Terry, two of his brothers and his sister rushed back into the blazing bedroom to rescue their toys. They all returned except Terry. Mrs. Pruitt and neighbor Richard Calloway raced into the house after the boy. They saw him lying on the bedroom floor, clutching his stuffed rabbit. But they were unable to help him because of flames.

She said Terry slept with the stuffed toy the night before.

Firemen said Terry's brother Dennis, 5, started the fire when he pushed a piece of paper in a floor heater. The blaze spread to his bed clothing which he quickly tore off and threw into a closet which soon ignited.

The other children are Stephen, 6, Mark, 3, and Cheryl, 4.

### Campaign Cuts Traffic Toll

PORTLAND (AP)—A campaign against traffic law violators has reduced the rate of traffic fatalities and accidents in Oregon, State Police Capt. Farley Mogan said Tuesday.

He reported that the death rate is 4 to 5 per cent less than in 1959.

Mogan said the decline is attributable mainly to an increase in the number of traffic citations and more emphasis on arrest of violators.

Mogan told a meeting of judges who hear traffic cases, "When arrests go up, then it's almost certain that the number of accidents and deaths go down."

## Demos Call Corbett Sole Rightful Claimant To Position

PORTLAND (AP)—The fight not only endorsed Corbett but also asked Sen. Harry Boivin of Klamath Falls to release his Democratic executive committee calling Sen. Alfred Corbett of Portland "the sole rightful claimant to the Democratic Party nomination."

Party secretary Blaine Whipple announced that the committee

The Democrats will have 20 seats, the Republicans 10 when the Senate convenes next month. Boivin earlier rejected suggestions that he withdraw from the contest. Boivin claims 9 Democratic and 10 Republican votes. The executive committee has insisted the caucus choice of Senate Democrats should get the support of all Senate Democrats.

Whipple said Corbett was the choice in two Democratic caucuses, the latest Monday night at Salem where he won a 10-2 vote. "It was the committee's contention," said Whipple, that Corbett "has been officially elected the Democratic Party's candidate."

Sixteen county central committees have endorsed Corbett and the executive committee's stand for Straub to resign his party post. Whipple said that of 18 committee members 13 attended the meeting and another sent in a proxy vote supporting Corbett and son of Portland, president of the Straub.

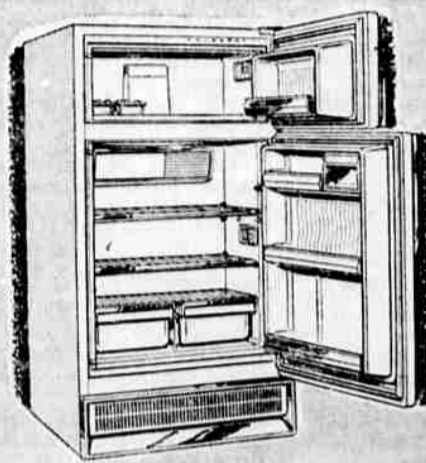

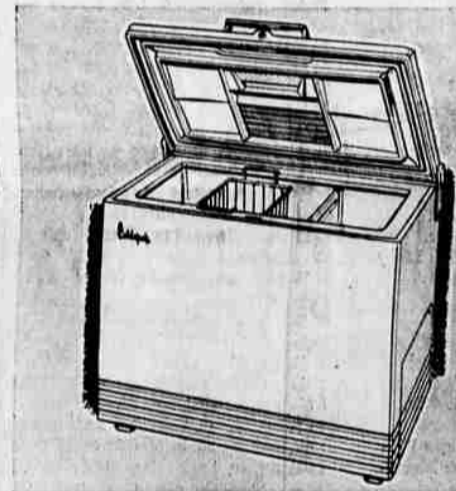
