

California Commissioner Disagrees With Deer Count

REDDING (UPI)—Henry Clineschmidt, a state fish and game commissioner, today took issue with a statement that there is a big discrepancy in the actual total of deer in Siskiyou and Modoc counties and the number claimed by the state.

The statement came Wednesday from Joe Shannon, a director of the Northern Counties Wildlife Conservation Association.

He said he accompanied a deer count party headed by Clineschmidt and including Fred Ross, Redding; Gordon Ashcraft, Yreka; and Ed Schneegas, Alturas.

Shannon claimed cold and snow had provided conditions favorable to finding deer at low elevations and bunched and "if there are more deer there, we didn't find them."
