

Ask New Phone System For Siskiyou Hospital

YREKA — A request for installation of a new telephone system in Siskiyou County General Hospital was heard by the Siskiyou County Board of Supervisors during a Tuesday morning session. The request was made because the system currently in use apparently is constantly failing.

The new system would cost an estimated \$908 in addition to monthly charges of \$290, said G. T. Spaulding, Pacific Telephone and Telegraph Company representative. The system now in use costs \$168 per month.

County hospital administrator Robert D. McKean explained that the present system fails often. The system, which consists of four trunk lines, feeds 20 stations and operates on batteries. Peak hospital call hours are between 7 and 10 a.m. When an overload of internal communications reaches a critical point, batteries wear out and the system fails until repairs are made, McKean said. The system was installed about 10 years ago.

Supervisor W. A. (Art) Barr pointed out that the system should have been constructed at the time of its installation to handle the present load.

Floyd Dill, manager of the Yreka P.T. & T. office, stated it was impossible then to determine requirements of the hospital today.

Supervisor S. C. (Clint) Jackson said the matter had not been included in the agenda soon enough to give the board an opportunity to consider it. He also said the county hospital board of directors should make a recommendation on a proposal to add a new telephone system to the hospital.

muir as an alternative to accepting an executive position with Kaiser Industries.

Lenton, whose accent and appearance still bear traces of his boyhood in Vermont, said he does not expect to get wealthy in Dunsmuir but he does expect to enjoy personal relationships and challenges of small town living while his productive capacities are still at peak level.

Lenton, 59, has a background of industry production management, particularly in tool designing fields. His previous chamber of commerce experience has been on the metropolitan level in Buffalo, N.Y.

Lenton said he began to realize there was no future in continuing in executive positions. It meant unrelieved concentration on job goals and abrupt retirement at 65.

The purchase of the motel was prompted by a general liking for the area, the fact that it was a one-man business and that the property included an attractive home for himself and his wife, Beryl, Lenton said.

Without waiting for introductions and encouragement, he plunged into community activities upon his arrival in Dunsmuir last spring by joining the chamber of commerce and taking part in the Key Club promotion of Freeway Day. In outlining his objectives to chamber members at a dinner meeting Wednesday night, Lenton said that the chamber should be a hard-hitting, fast-acting body worthy of respect of the community, city government and area. He said he will expect every chamber member to contribute to these goals.

He placed emphasis on lending encouragement to new people in the community, regardless of profession, business or trade.

Lenton spoke of his confidence in his fellow officers—Bill Starkey, vice president; Gary Girdler, secretary, and Don Warner, treasurer.

The new board of directors consists of Ted Fay, J. "Bud" Lachenmyer, Victor Petrovic, Marjorie Young, Lee Huddle, James Lambert, Signa Gilson, Helen Huttuff, William Febrero and Robert Kenoyer.

A standing vote of appreciation was given Ted Fay who served as president of the chamber this past year. About 50 businessmen and women attended the chamber dinner at the Travelers Hotel.

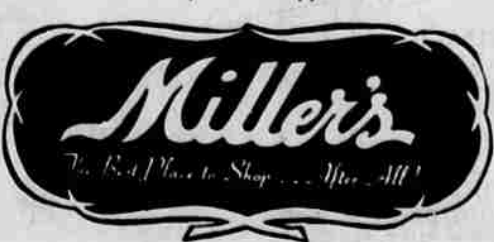

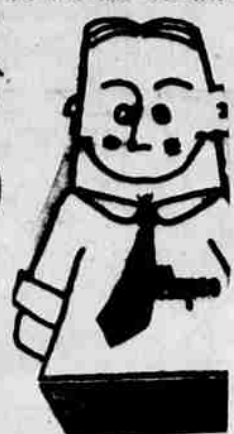

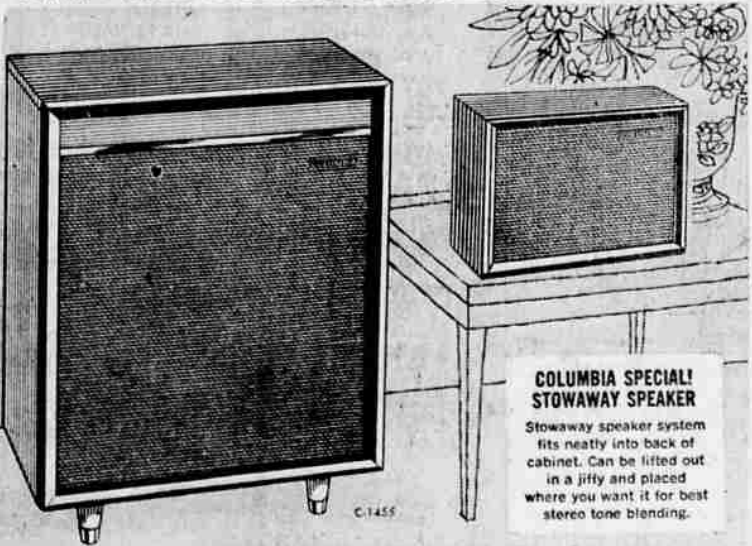
