Tissue Wreath A Bit Different

Although most homemakers would agree that holiday time is perhaps the busiest time of the year, they'd also have to agree that the holidays provide many opportunities for enjoyable "do-it-yourself" projects.

This year for something just a bit different, try making your own Christmas wreath out of tissues. It's inexpensive, easy and best of all, it's something the youngsters can help with.

For extra fun, you may want to use the new holly green and red tissues, available now for the first time in a gay Christmas carton. Tissue colors alternate—green and red—as you pull the tissues from the package. Or, if you prefer, use the standard tissue colors of your choice. Only other materials you'll need are chicken wire, 18-inches square, and a package of pipe cleaners.

Here's how to do it: Form the chicken wire into the shape of a wreath, with about a six-inch opening in the center. Next, make flowers. Take a tissue folded in half and cut along the crease. Leaving the two pieces of tissue together, accordion pleat

the tissue from end to end. Each pleat would be about one-half inch wide. Fold a pipe cleaner in half around the center of the pleated tissue and twist once to hold the tissue firmly in place. Fan out the pleats, then separate the four thicknesses of tissue to form the flower. Attach the tissue flowers to the wire wreath, twisting the pipe cleaner ends to hold the flowers in place. Arrange the flowers close together so the wire does not show through. The wreath will require about 25 tissue flowers. With the new holly green and red tissues, you can build really authentic holiday wreaths and have one for every room in the house. These unusual tissues are useful as party favors, too, for the grownups and for children.
