



Modoc Lumber Bids High

A total of 3,600,000 board feet of timber in the North Scott Creek sale area in Klamath District, Rogue River National Forest, just east of Crater Lake National Park, sold to Modoc Lumber Company, Klamath Falls, for \$88,550 Friday afternoon.

The forest service appraised the timber at \$73,706 and set the minimum bid price at that figure.

Klamath Lumber and Box Company, Klamath Falls, was the only other qualified bidder. Buyers for the two companies bid a total of 82 rounds.

The area contains an estimated 1,900,000 board feet of ponderosa pine, 1,300,000 feet of sugar pine, and 400,000 feet of Shasta red fir and other species.

Minimum bids and actual bids, in that order, were as follows: Ponderosa pine, \$19.96, \$26.50; sugar pine, \$26, \$26; and Shasta red fir and other species, \$5, \$11. The forest service will auction 1,600,000 feet of Douglas fir, 500,000 feet of ponderosa, white and sugar pine and 1,500,000 feet of white fir and other species in the Seldom Creek sale area in the district office in the post office building Wednesday, Dec. 21, at 3 p.m.

Minimum bid per thousand feet, said District Ranger Earl M. Karlinger, is \$22.06 for Douglas fir, \$18.15 for pine species and \$7.40 for white fir and other species.

Two Killed In Oregon Car Crashes

Two persons died in traffic accidents in Oregon Friday night, raising the state's traffic toll for the year to 447 in the Associated Press tabulation.

Jerry Lee Mehrlich, 14, son of Mr. and Mrs. H. H. Mehrlich, Portland, was killed and four persons were injured in an intersection collision at Halsey Blvd., and 148th Avenue in the Northeast Portland suburbs. He was a passenger in a car driven by his brother, Robert, 18. The driver of the other car, Mrs. Marjory Roberts, 42, and two of her children, also were injured.

Jean Frances Loganbill, 37, Salem, was fatally injured when the car she was riding in rolled over and hit a power pole on Highway 99-E one mile south of Woodburn shortly before midnight. She was alone in the car.

Required Shots For Dogs Asked

PORTLAND (AP) — Mandatory inoculation of dogs throughout Oregon to stop the spread of rabies was proposed Thursday by Dr. Carl L. Holm, the new president of the Oregon Board of Health.

The board voted, however, to have the Health Department staff make a new study of the rabies situation and report back at the next meeting of the board Jan. 10.

In recent months, the Health Department laboratory has found rabies in seven rabid bats and a dog. Two persons have been bitten.

Six of the rabid bats were discovered in the Medford-Klamath Falls area and the other at The Dalles.

Veterinarians in many areas have agreed to reduce fees from \$5 to \$3.50 for inoculating animals.

Lone Survivor Tells Of Plane Crash

NEW YORK (UPI)—Stephen Baltz, 11, watched the snow swirling over New York City from the window of the big plane taking him to a family Christmas reunion. He didn't know he was blessed by fate.

Minutes later he was lying burned and broken in a snow bank on a Brooklyn street. The flames from the burning airliner lighted his dazed and bleeding face.

"Am I going to die?" he murmured through burned lips.

But Stephen was lucky. He was the only survivor of the nation's worst air crash. The other 127 passengers on two planes died. He is expected to live.

Stephen was thrown from the broken tail section of the United Air Lines DC8, his clothes flaming with burning jet fuel.

A policeman beat out the flames and wrapped him in his rain coat. A woman called for blankets which were thrown to her from windows of apartments and another man held an umbrella over the injured boy to shield him from the snow and sleet.

"Mommy, Daddy," he kept saying.

"He was in terrific pain," Mrs. Dorothy Fletcher said, "but he had only one complaint." "My legs are so cold," she quoted Stephen as saying.

He was taken to Methodist Hospital in a police car and treated for shock. It was found he had a broken leg, internal injuries and burns over much of his upper body.

He gave his wallet to a doctor and asked him to call his father. He roused again during treatment to tell doctors his mother was waiting for him at the airport.

Stephen, of Wilmette, Ill., had been put on the plane Friday morning by his father, W. S. Baltz, vice president and general counsel of the Admiral Corp. His sister and mother were in New York visiting his grandparents and were waiting for him at Idlewild Airport.

Stephen told doctors why he never arrived:

"I remember looking out the plane window at the snow below covering the city. It looked like a picture out of a fairy book. Then all of a sudden there was an explosion.

"The plane started to fall and people started to scream. I held on to my seat and then the plane crashed.

"That's all I remember until I woke up here," he said.
