Firemen Called To Phone Office

City firemen rushed to Pacific Telephone and Telegraph headquarters at Ninth and Main streets Thursday evening and found smoke pouring from a defective pump in the building's basement.

Firemen said the basement and upstairs office suffered an undetermined amount of smoke damage.

Suburban Department firemen put out a blaze in a trailer home occupied by F. C. Walcott at 2243 Washburn Way shortly after midnight Friday. They said a small hole was burned in the ceiling.

Firemen were not able to determine cause of the fire.

Truck Tips, Pipes Spilled

A diesel truck upset on icy pavement near here Friday morning and spilled several 80-foot lengths of thick pipe in a gutter.

The driver, Harold Harkey, 4833 Homedale Road, Klamath Falls, apparently was not injured.

The accident occurred a half-mile from Highway 66 on Sprague River Road. Harkey said he lost control due to slick pavement about 8 a.m. County sheriff's deputies are investigating.

Harkey was traveling from the Western Pipeline Company pipe depot at Sprague River to Malin where the company's crews are installing a section of Pacific Gas and Electric natural gas line.

Neither truck nor pipe was badly damaged, apparently.
