Stick four old match stems in one side of a potato for legs. A short piece of pipe cleaner added at one end makes a good tail and may be shaped to suit your wishes. Two black buttons on the other end form the eyes. A mouth can

be made by scraping off a curved line of the potato's skin. Make ears or horns from small bits of paper, and glue them in place.

The length of the legs and the shape of the tail, mouth, and ears determine the type of animal you make. With imagination and your own ideas, you'll soon have a zoo at home!

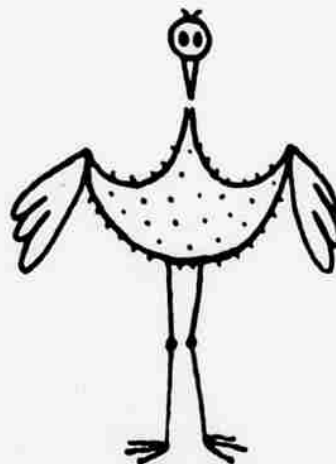
A circle drawn most any place
