

Scala Funeral Saturday

Funeral services for Domenico B. Scala, 61, who died at the family home Dec. 14 were held Saturday at 9:30 a.m. in Sacred Heart Church where he was a member. Mr. T. P. Casey officiated. Recitation of the Holy Rosary was at 8 p.m. Friday in O'Hair's Memorial Chapel. Final rites and interment were in Mt. Calvary cemetery.

Mr. Scala was born in Grosseto, Italy, Aug. 29, 1899, and came to Yreka in 1920 working in the dairy business, later at

Wood in the lumber industry. He came to Klamath Falls in 1926. He was married Sept. 30, 1930, to Ida Del Fatti and since then with Mrs. Scala had operated a dairy and crop ranch in the Midland district, developed by Mrs. Scala's parents.

He served in World War I in Italy for 44 months during some of the heaviest engagements of the war.

The purpose of the assembly is in harmony with the belief of Jehovah's Witnesses that the knowledge gained from being taught by Jehovah God is meant to be shared; that it is the divine purpose that Christians must inform peace seekers of God's will. Members of the Klamath Falls congregation will join 800-1,000 delegates from 23 other congregations from Southern Oregon and Northern California at weekend convention sessions in the Redwood Empire city.

Climax of the meeting will be the public talk by principal speaker, Lester M. Dugan, Sunday, Jan. 8, at 3 p.m. As special representative of the group's worldwide headquarters in Brooklyn, he will speak on the subject "Is God Interested in the Affairs of Men?"

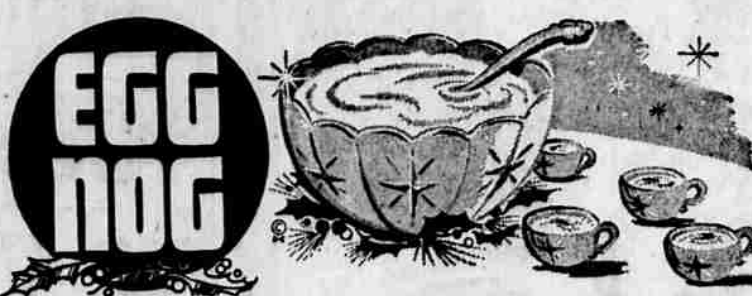
VOTE EDGE TRIMMED

HONOLULU (AP)—Vice President Richard M. Nixon's popular vote edge in Hawaii over President-elect John F. Kennedy has been trimmed from 141 to 61.

Nixon's margin was reduced as a result of Thursday's recount of 34 of Hawaii's 240 precincts. Hawaii has three electoral votes. Democrats immediately pressed for a complete recount before the electors meet at 2 p.m. Monday. The recount was presided over by Circuit Judge Ronald B. Jamieson. Nixon's total now stands at 92,403. Kennedy has 92,342.
